Sample

Our sample was developed from the voter files originally compiled by the Boulder County Elections Division. We matched the demographics of City of Boulder likely November 2023 voters.

Data Collection Explained

Interviews were conducted by phone (33%) and online (67%) modes. Phone interviews were conducted via landline (34%) or mobile (66%). Online participants were invited by email (50%) and text message (50%).

Respondents in all modes chose their preferred language, English (99%) and Spanish (1%).


The online survey was accessible by computer, tablet, and smart phone.

Security measures precluded individuals from completing the survey more than once.



Housing affordability and homelessness are the most important issues facing Boulder voters



























Among those who initially voted "no"











Results by years of residency, vote propensity, and initial vote


