Boulder Reservoir Boating Rules

- 1. All Colorado State boating statutes and regulations, City of Boulder revised code and Boulder Reservoir rules and policies apply and are enforced by reservoir lake patrol, BPD, and OSMP rangers. Violators may be ticketed. Please visit the Colorado State Parks website at http://parks.state.co.us/boating or call 303-791-1954 for more information.
- 2. All watercraft must display a current City of Boulder Reservoir permit. Reservoir permit must be placed on the port (left) side of watercraft hull. **Permit must be applied to vessel by Reservoir personnel only!**
- 3. All watercraft (including but not limited to sailboats, powerboats, kayaks, canoes, paddle boards, inner tubes, water-skis, wakeboards, flotation devices, etc.) must be inspected upon entry into the park, even if the item will not contact the water or be used. All watercraft may only be launched from the south shore after successful completion of an ANS inspection! At no time can any watercraft touch, launch from, or be moored on the North Shore.
- 4. Reservoir pattern is always counterclockwise, (keep buoys on starboard [right] side, and rafts on port [left] side). See attached map on reverse side.
 - Full lap counterclockwise around all center rafts; at least 150 feet from shoreline.
 - Half lap (north or south) counterclockwise around lake, and in-between row of center rafts and centerline buoys (buoys on starboard side, and rafts on port side).
- 5. All watercraft must remain "wakeless" or maintain a maximum speed of 5mph or less within all "NO WAKE" buoys and mooring areas.
 - a. "The term "wake" means a movement of the water created by a boat underway, great enough to disturb a boat at rest."
- 6. <u>No Wake/Quiet Hours</u>: See our <u>website</u> for most up-to-date information. Additional days and times will be added for specific events (see <u>event calendar</u>).
- 7. Skiing starts are prohibited from loading areas, "NO WAKE" areas, docks, center and swim rafts and the shore. Skiers must start from inside the water and outside buoyed areas! Expand Adaptive Water Ski Program is excepted during their designated operation time.
- 8. Vessels with skiers or objects in tow have right-of-way.
- 9. Any person being towed, including surfers, must always wear a PFD.
- 10. Vessels with people in tow must have an observer, separate from the driver, in the boat at all times. The observer is responsible for prominently displaying the skier advisory flag (12" x 12" fluorescent orange or red flag). This flag serves as a warning to other vessels and is up the entire duration that the towed person/people are actually IN (not on top of) the water. The flag then MUST be lowered when the towed person(s) is either back in the boat or have resumed being towed
- 11. Any person 14 or 15 years of age must take a boating safety course approved by the Colorado State Parks and must always keep proof of course completion with them while operating a motorboat.
- 12. No person shall operate a vessel upon waters of this state under any condition or in any manner that the vessel emits a sound level in excess of 86 decibels on "A" weighted scale when measured from a distance of 50 feet or more from the vessel.
- 13. **All persons 12 and under are required to be always wearing a PFD** while on a boat or being towed, unless they are inside an enclosed cabin.
- 14. Personal Watercraft, including jet skis, e-foils, and jet boards are prohibited, except for City of Boulder water safety operations, including Expand.
- 15. **Swimming is prohibited** outside the designated swim area. This includes swimming from shore and off watercraft.
- 16. Watercraft may not enter the protected Wildlife Habitat areas for any reason.
- 17. Fueling on or around the water is **prohibited.**
- 18. All watercraft must be OFF the water 1 hour prior to facility closure.
