

RESOLUTION 80

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE 2024 CITY OF BOULDER FOREST GLEN TRANSIT PASS GENERAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT PROPERTY TAX MILL LEVY FOR PAYMENT OF EXPENDITURES, IN PART, OF THE DISTRICT DURING THE FISCAL YEAR 2025, BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2025; AND SETTING FORTH RELATED DETAILS

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BOULDER, COLORADO, ACTING AS THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CITY OF BOULDER FOREST GLEN TRANSIT PASS GENERAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT, HEREBY FINDS AND RECITES THAT:

A. WHEREAS, the Board of Directors (the “Board”) of the City of Boulder Forest Glen Transit Pass General Improvement District (the “District”) has prepared and adopted a budget for the District for the 2025 fiscal year; and

B. WHEREAS, the Board has reviewed the projected expenditures of the District for 2025; and

C. WHEREAS, the Board has considered all sources of revenue of the District; and

D. WHEREAS, the Board has determined that a tax levy of 1.381 should therefore be imposed; and

E. WHEREAS, to conform with the county information, a mill levy credit of 0.929 mills is necessary for a total of 1.381 mills to be assessed upon each dollar of assessed valuation of all taxable property with the city.

BASED ON THE FINDINGS MADE IN THIS RESOLUTION, ABOVE, BE IT

**RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BOULDER, COLORADO,
ACTING AS THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CITY OF BOULDER FOREST
GLEN TRANSIT PASS GENERAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT, THAT:**

Section 1. Effective at 12:00 Midnight at the end of December 31, 2024, there is hereby levied for the year of 2024, to be collected in 2025 a tax of 1.381 mills upon each dollar of the total assessed valuation of all taxable property within the area of the District. The levy includes the following components:

General Operating and Debt	2.310
Less: Mill Levy Credit	<u>(0.929)</u>
Net Mill Levy	1.381

Section 2. The Secretary of the District is directed to certify the within levy to the County Assessor, Boulder County, Colorado.
