I am interested in serving on the Arts Commission because a thriving, vibrant arts community makes our city more livable, inviting, and interesting. While I am a relatively new resident in Boulder, my family has decades long ties to the City and we have had a place between Boulder and Nederland for many years. I have long enjoyed the evolving vibrant arts scene here - it was no surprise to me when Boulder was named one of the top 10 medium-sized arts communities in the US - the thriving arts scene is one of the reasons we chose to relocate to the downtown area of the city. As a fiber artist and arts supporter and enthusiast, I believe art can connect us more deeply to place and to those with whom we share it. Finding more and new ways to support our local art community and to engage our neighbors in the arts, gives us a terrific opportunity to enhance community well-being, connect us more deeply to the place we live, and bring more joy and fun to our city.

This is an exciting time in the life of Boulder to engage more deeply in ways to support and grow the arts here. As a result of extensive service experiences on Boards and a Town Commission in the past, I understand the role volunteers have in such a position, and I am excited about the opportunity to contribute to the Boulder community in this capacity. The kinds of skills I would bring to the role of Commissioner stem from my long career as a scientist and professor, my service on many local, regional and national Boards, and my experience on the Town of Berthoud CO Planning Commission and as Chair of the Committee that oversaw the work of gathering public input and drafting the refreshed Town Comprehensive Plan. Beyond these experiences, I am very interested in developing new connections with both artists and arts organizations in Boulder and I am very excited learning more about the arts community in the city.

2. Have you had any experience(s) with this Board or the services it oversees?

I have not had previous experience with the Commission other than viewing videos of past meetings, and reading the materials available on the City website about the Commission and its portfolio. Since moving to Boulder I have started making connections with local arts organizations and would welcome the experience of being a liaison with artists and arts organizations. Through the background research I have done to learn more about the commission and the planning processes underway, it is my understanding that experience/expertise related to community engagement, using data in decision making, ensuring access to the arts across many dimensions of diversity, and responsible governance, assessment and oversite of publicly funded programs are particularly relevant in work of the Commission in the coming years. I believe many of the skills I developed and experiences I have had resonate well with the work of the Arts Commission.

In my work as a scientist, I wrote grants to fund my research and oversaw the work of staff who implemented programs related to the grants. I have extensive experience in program development, assessment, and reporting, and I have served on scores of grant review panels at local, regional and national levels. I also have created programs to engage minority and marginalized groups in science and STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, ARTS, and Mathematics) programs. Some of the particular skills and experiences I have that seem timely and relevant include strategic thinking and planning, developing milestones and formative and summative tools to assess progress toward meeting programmatic goals, leading community input discussions as part of community engagement, and building community and nurturing partnerships. In my role as a university administrator, I also gained experience in conflict mediation, budgeting, and implementing diversity initiatives. I hope that these skills and experiences would add some helpful perspectives to the work of the Commission arts and culture staff.

I might also add a new dimension of diversity to the Commission. One of the fastest growing segments of the population in Boulder is senior citizens, and engagement and arts and cultural programs can have a truly positive influence on the overall quality of life for older residents in our community. I would hope that I could, as appropriate, offer a perspective that considers the concerns and priorities of older residents in the work of the Office of Arts and Culture staff and the Arts Commission.

3. If appointed, what do you hope to achieve through your service on this board/commission?

First, I would look forward to building relationships to be a good collaborator on the work with the commissioners and staff. I would hope through my service to be an effective, engaged, and enthusiastic liaison between the Commission and the Boulder arts community to better identify needs and opportunities in the arts community, and to find creative ways to prioritize and meet those needs. I would like to help strengthen the capacity for meaningful assessment of arts programs funded by the City. I would be especially excited to help nurture current and new linkages between the arts and science communities - artists are crucial partners for interpreting science in ways that resonate with the communities they live in. Finally I would hope that my service helped the Commission and Office of Arts and Culture provide more opportunities for artists and community members alike for creative expression and engagement.

If appointed, I hope to improve awareness in the community through improved communication and marketing strategies of local art and artistic events/activities.

As a finance professional, I would learn how monies have been historically allocated and approved/spent by this commission, and ensure that project approvals meet the responsibilities and goals of this board/commission before making any recommendations or approvals on projects, particularly given the increasing fiscal pressures on government spending. Using this business background, I would advise the city council in connection with all matters relating to the artistic and cultural development of the city. I also have experience scoring and approving grant applications.

I do not represent any particular art discipline, and believe that governing bodies should not necessarily be "representative" of a particular group, but should rather engage in committee business with the intent towards the greater good (of Boulder, and its art community), rather than expressing the interests of a particular representative group.

The most important way to support artists is through increased awareness, participation and access to the arts - all arts. If community members aren't aware of what events are taking place, nor the opportunities to get involved, then we aren't doing our best to promote and make available these experiences. I personally believe that there are many artistic events taking place in the City of Boulder (theatre, exhibitions, structural art) that I am not aware of, and this is my loss, my households' loss, and a loss to the artists that would otherwise gain exposure to a new audience.

If appointed, I would advocate for and assist with marketing/advertising efforts to better promote these activities for improved citizen and artist engagement, and also add fiscal discipline and experience in assessing and selecting projects for approval.

Thank you for the opportunity to apply to serve on the Boulder Arts Commission! I've been a resident of Boulder for about 2.5 years and during that time the arts and cultural life of the city has become central to my family's experience of this community. The density, quality, and accessibility of artistic activity in Boulder is truly special, and I am eager to contribute my time and professional experience in service of sustaining and strengthening it.

In my current professional role, I serve as Assistant Dean for Strategic Initiatives at the College of Music at CU Boulder. In this role I work closely every day with students, faculty, and staff at the College of Music, including CU Presents and Macky Auditorium, units that regularly interface with the Boulder arts ecosystem. I've also been involved with the transition of Sundance Film Festival to Boulder, specifically the ways in which SFF will utilize CU venues and impact the broader university and city community.

Prior to moving to Colorado, I lived and worked for 16 years in Minnesota, focusing on bipartisan and nonpartisan public policy work. This included three years serving as the executive director a nonprofit organization (\$1M budget, 6 FTE staff, 16-member board), which made me very familiar with the staffing, budgeting and financial realities of nonprofit organizations, and how organizations with slim margins can have an enormous positive impact on the community. While in Minneapolis, I also served on the board of directors (with two years as board chair) of the MacPhail Center for Music, the nation's largest community music school, where I worked closely with fellow board members and staff on strategy, financial oversight, and mission alignment.

Across these roles, I have developed a strong ability to balance big-picture vision with practical implementation, to listen carefully to diverse perspectives, and to serve as a thoughtful connector between organizations and stakeholders. I believe these skills, combined with my lived experience as a Boulder resident and arts participant, would allow me to be an effective and engaged member of the Boulder Arts Commission.

In serving on the Boulder Arts Commission, I hope to provide greater transparency and collaboration between CU and the broader arts community. I would bring positive energy, a thoughtful and respectful approach, and professional expertise in nonprofit leadership, music/arts, and board governance. I worked as a paid pianist from when I was 10 years old, starting out accompanying violinists, moving on to playing at the Gondolier Restaurant in Boulder when I was in high school, and playing at the Foxhill Country Club as well. I helped offset my costs largely with my work as a musician. I also have sang and played in bands in Boulder and surrounding areas, in Hollywood, and in Brazil. These days, my music is slated to be used for an independent full-length feature film being produced by a director in Los Angeles who works for Fox. I wrote part of the screenplay and will also act in this film.

I founded and ran a literary and arts organization which published a journal called Many Mountains Moving that published literary greats such as Allen Ginsberg, Isabelle Allende, Ursula K. LeGuin, and more, including new and emerging voices and visual artists. After decades of working as an editor and publisher, my own first book will be published this year as well. This gives me a solid background and perspective as a working artist of a number of genres as well as extensive experience in managing and administration in the arts.

I have extensive grant-writing experience and have also advised artists and organizations on submitting a solid grant proposal. I also have experience evaluating grant proposals and also artist applications for fellowships, etc., including judging applicants for the Rocky Mountain Women's Institute, where I served as a fellow for fiction. I also was a recipient for the Colorado Council on the Arts for my fiction.

I have many connections in the arts statewide as well as nationally. Also, there wasn't a way to put this information in on the online form, but I moved here when I was 13 and have spent much of my life here. I have also, since then, spent time in Missouri for grad school, a couple years in Japan, a couple years in Hollywood, and I lived half-time in Brazil for a number of years, and lived in Lafayette as well while spending much of my time in other places for work. In all the places I lived (other than Japan), I have been very active in the arts communities and have learned a lot of knowledge that I'd like to bring to my hometown. I am at a point in my life where I am invested in investing in my hometown that has made me who I am today as an artist and as a person.

I am passionate about using my experience and knowledge to nurture our talented artists and help them blossom and being an advisor will be a perfect match for my skills to give to BAC and our arts organizations and individual artists.

2. Have you had any experience(s) with this Board or the services it oversees?

I was on the committee to work with the BAC as the literary representative to help update the cultural master plan update when Donna was on board. Representatives from the arts (Karen Gerrity, Alison Moore, etc.) were all working with BAC to help update the cultural master plan. I was the literary representative because I ran a literary and arts nonprofit called Many Mountains Moving and we published international as well as local authors, sponsored readings, and did a monthly reading series and open mic in partnership with BMoCA at the time. BAC also gave a grant to my nonprofit, Many Mountains Moving (MMM), which was hugely appreciated. I ran MMM for a decade until I had to retire when given a 7 percent chance of survival from a rare and aggressive cancer but I am raring to re-emerge in a different role. Together we can rock with me in my new role as part of the greater whole.

Also, I (like everyone in the area) have benefitted by being part of the local organizations supported by the BAC and have attended many of the events sponsored by the BAC.

3. If appointed, what do you hope to achieve through your service on this board/commission?

I would like to help fill the gaps left in the BAC with the loss of their two excellent advisors who are finishing up their terms. I understand that one of the people leaving has extensive arts-education experience. While obviously I can never replace them, I can contribute my own extensive experience with arts education. I have worked in arts education in middle-school education through university level and beyond, and also collaborate with a number of people and organizations in arts education. I also can bring my perspective as a working artist to the BAC. I collaborate with a lot of artists in the area from students to elderly artists and have my finger on the emotional pulse of the artist community in many fields (music, visual arts, writing, film, and more), and can help represent their voices.

I will help Boulder prepare for a huge boost in the arts including in film as Sundance is coming to the area. This boost will help all the arms of our art community as well as the business owners and residents. I will also help Boulder develop a plan for all of us thriving (the city, the community, the businesses, and the artists) even in a time of uncertainty in ways that support the unique needs of Boulder artists, building on the solid and wonderful blueprint the BAC has already created. Visionary and practical collaboration is the key to making the most of our amazing resources of talent and existing infrastructure, building on the amazing existing blueprint created by the BAC.

He discussed how he was railroaded by a racist criminal justice system in Alabama. The lawyer Bryan Stevenson, author of Just Mercy, came to Mr. Hinton's rescue by clearing him of all charges. The audience was transformed by Mr. Hinton's testimony. This is the power of inspired storytelling. Through my membership on various arts-related committees, I have helped to bring the Fisk Jubilee Singers and the Nashville African American Wind Symphony to Boulder. These performances have widened the horizons of youth (particularly youth of color) in Boulder. I want to continue this work as a member of the Boulder Arts Commission.

I studied viola at the New England Conservatory of Music as an undergraduate. My professional credits include performances with the MIT Chamber Players, the Howard County Ballet Orchestra, and Opera Express - a chamber opera company on the East Coast. I currently perform as a church musician in the Front Range. While I am grateful to have had these experiences, singing with the Spirituals Project is my greatest achievement in the performing arts. The Spirituals Project, founded by Martin Luther King's speechwriter Dr. Vincent Harding, is dedicated to sharing this art form with the nation.

I also champion creative orthodoxies, and a breadth and depth of reflections on Boulder in 2026 that can and will tell our stories in this extraordinary moment in time.

I became an Arts Commissioner in 2023, filling a vacancy, and that opportunity has now reached its planned conclusion. Even more so than when I first applied, I am passionate about the arts and all that local artists and organizations bring to our Boulder community, both culturally and economically. Having been engaged more fully with the local arts scene over the last 3 years has only increased my passion for and commitment to ensuring Boulder citizens can participate in the arts, as makers, learners, hobbyists, and consumers, and to continue reducing barriers to access where they exist.

I'm eager to continue serving on the commission for a complete term because there are exciting opportunities and challenges facing the arts and culture of Boulder, and my voice and experience will be an asset in addressing the challenges that lie ahead. These include finding affordable access to venue and studio spaces, assessing and continuing to adapt the recent changes to the grants program, preparing for Sundance, and rolling out the new Cultural Blueprint.

I hold a master's in education with a focus on arts in education and currently work at Anschutz medical campus using theatre to develop health professional students' communication skills and clinical exam technique. I developed my interest in theatre education when I moved to Boulder in the mid-90s, running theatre camps and classes at Peanut Butter Players and Rocky Mountain Theatre, as well as for neighboring cities..

After receiving my masters, I returned to Boulder and ran the BreakThrough Arts program through the YMCA teen department, offering free after-school arts classes to young people in Boulder (funded in part by the City of Boulder Youth Opportunities Advisory Board). I have grant writing and fundraising experience and in addition to my dramatic work in my 'day job', I am also a freelance writer, storyteller, and stand-up comic. Most importantly, I love the arts and relish the opportunity to help them infuse the City of Boulder with even more life and excitement, solidifying its status as an artistic hub and destination.

2. Have you had any experience(s) with this Board or the services it oversees?

As stated above, I am currently completing a vacancy fill position as a City of Boulder Arts Commissioner. As a result, I have in-depth knowledge of the Arts Commission brief, including the grants process, supporting the development of the cultural blueprint, and overseeing public art. I have a thorough understanding of how grant proposals are evaluated and how decision-making balances artistic merit, public impact, and the need for diverse voices. Serving on the commission over the past three years has helped me better crystallize the city's role in supporting arts and culture-not only as a major funding partner to over 150 artists annually, with more than \$1M worth of grants, but also as a steward of cultural infrastructure and a convener of divergent perspectives.

During my time on the commission, there has been an effort on the part of both the commission and many of our local arts organizations to thoughtfully engage in transparent -and oftentimes challenging - dialogues about how existing systems create barriers for some artists and communities. These continuing conversations ultimately make our process stronger and the arts more representative of the plethora of Boulderites' viewpoints.

My time on the commission has also allowed and encouraged me to engage more broadly with the Boulder arts community, offering another entry point to observe the intersection between local arts funding and the cultural bounty it provides. This perspective allows me to observe the effects of funding, programming, and equity initiatives from the audience and supporter side. Together, these experiences have given me a deep and well-rounded understanding of the arts commission's work-both its strengths, which I proudly proclaim and discuss at every opportunity, and its ongoing areas for growth that I, along with fellow commissioners, am actively working to address.

3. If appointed, what do you hope to achieve through your service on this board/commission?

If re-appointed, I am excited to continue the work I've been doing as a City of Boulder Arts Commissioner. There are two pressing agenda items I am eager to help see through: the Culture Blueprint and Sundance.

The Arts Commission will be involved with raising awareness about the Blueprint as the Staff team rolls it out. I plan to be an ambassador to the community, sharing the news of the blueprint beyond "the usual suspects." In my time on the Commission, I have had too many moments of surprise when encountering community members unfamiliar with all that the City of Boulder does to support the arts. For example, a friend who has lived in NoBo for 20 years was not aware of First Fridays, so I had her join me at one this summer, and she's been a regular since! The creation of the blueprint has already worked to engage not only those community members already steeped in the arts and culture initiatives in Boulder, but also introduced other community members of all that is offered.

Sundance is another big opportunity. This is our chance to establish Boulder on the world cultural map. In addition to the economic impact and upgrades to local venue infrastructure, the festival is a chance to showcase the plethora of arts and culture Boulderites enjoy year-round- even when Timothy Chalamet isn't browsing the titles at the Boulder Bookstore, and the offerings at Peppercorn are not being perused by Emma Stone!

My other personal areas of interest as a commissioner include increasing access to affordable venue and studio space; ensuring artists can live and work, affordably, in Boulder; and supporting and engaging the next generation of art makers and partakers.

I'm excited to continue listening, collaborating, asking good questions, and helping shape decisions that allow creativity to thrive across neighborhoods, disciplines, and communities. As an Arts Commissioner, I will help ensure Boulder's arts scene is bold, accessible, and- because we're Boulder- still, a little bit weird!

It is difficult to ignore the amount of land and commercial real estate sitting unused or underutilized while housing costs and business rents continue to rise. While housing affordability is an important focus, I am also interested in how zoning and variance decisions affect small businesses - their ability to start, stay, and grow in Boulder. As someone beginning a small business myself, I often ask why it can feel easier and less costly to locate just outside Boulder in places like Erie.

I deeply value Boulder's green space, trail system, and environmental priorities and believe those assets must be protected. At the same time, I think thoughtful development and redevelopment can coexist with preservation when decisions are made carefully. Ongoing community conversations, such as those around the airport or long-standing properties like the Celestial Seasonings site, highlight the need to balance neighborhood concerns, citywide interests, and long-term land use goals. I would aim to approach these questions with curiosity, fairness, and respect for both individual applicants and the broader Boulder community.

I am passionately interested in the economic development success of the city, as a resident, previous business owner, and someone thoroughly engaged in the statewide conversation around economic development. I believe that the development community wants to see pragmatic, predictable development processes, and an urban renewal authority that can support projects that wouldn't otherwise happen without its support, specifically projects that utilize tax increment financing to secure community priorities and public benefit from development.

I currently serve as Director of Operations for Downtown Colorado, Inc., a non-profit member-based organization of which the City of Boulder is a member, and the Downtown Boulder Partnership is also a member. Our organization advises title 31 quasi-governmental districts (URA, DDA, BID) around the state, as well as municipal partners and communities interested in forming these organizations. We provide strategic planning, peer networking, education, outreach, and advocacy for these districts. In my role, I have advised dozens of communities, and these affiliated districts, in creating plans of development, implementing best practices, sharing TIF agreement strategies for mitigating community risk and maximizing community benefit, community formation elections, drafting and implementing bylaws and plans of development, and strategic alignment with other municipal departments for maximum collaboration.

Professionally, prior to being with DCI, I was the Assistant Town Manager in Eagle, Colorado where I started their department of Economic Development, and oversaw the process to form a Downtown Development Authority, adopt bylaws, draft and implement the budget as Interim Executive Director, negotiate TIF agreements, and implement community benefit programs to spur economic development and retain local businesses during the COVID pandemic. Prior to that role, I owned several businesses in Boulder, including Spark Boulder, a non-profit student-focused incubator and accelerator located on University Hill, Arete Logistics, a third-party logistics provider for local businesses specializing in the outdoor recreation space, and Cafe Play, a coffee shop and video game retail store on University Hill.

I have a MPA from CU Denver, earning a Best and Brightest Fellowship through the State of Colorado, a Masters of Communication from CU Boulder with research in public engagement, and an Bachelors of Environmental Design from CU Boulder, with my capstone focused on special taxing districts in University towns.

I am a member in good standing with the International City Managers Association (ICMA) and the International Economic

Development Council (IEDC), I expect to earn my CEcD credentials (Certified Economic Developer) from IEDC this year, having completed all required coursework and need to sit for the test this summer, and I am also certified with the International Town-Gown Association (ITGA), of which Boulder was one of the founding members.

I have previously served for seven years on the University Hill Commercial Area Management Commission (UHCAMC), serving six years as chair from 2008-2014. As an undergraduate student I was the CUSG Neighborhood Relations Director for two different administrations (2012, 2014), acting as a liaison between the City of Boulder and Student Government on a variety of issues, including helping pass the University Hill Residential Service District election in 2012. I have served as a workgroup member of the City of Boulder's 2013-2014 Capital Improvement Plan, which resulted in the successful (and recently reapproved) local sales tax initiative to fund City capital improvements. I have also served on the City's Public Participation Working Group (2016-2018), helping to co-author the final report and present the findings to City Council in 2018.

2. Have you had any experience(s) with this Board or the services it oversees?

BURA has been dormant for several decades, so I do not have experience with it, per se. However, professionally, we as DCI and I in particular have had conversations with City staff, council members, local business owners and developers, and the Downtown Boulder Partnership in a variety of settings to provide expertise and guidance on best practices for implementing fiscal policies around tax increment financing.

Professionally, I have served as Executive Director of a Tax Increment Finance district (Eagle DDA), and our organization is a non-profit support organization for URAs around the State. I have nearly a decade of direct experience with these types of organizations, their statutes, operating bylaws, fiscal policies, incentive mechanisms, development agreements, and community engagement needed to see URAs administer their funds effectively.

3. If appointed, what do you hope to achieve through your service on this board/commission?

I would like to see strategic economic development take place to further the City of Boulder's Comprehensive Plan and strategic economic development initiatives. Economically, the City has weathered COVID and recent economic disruptions like the closure of federal labs and the relocation of primary employers. The City also struggles mightily with housing affordability, and TIF used through URAs are one of the most common sources of additional affordable housing funds, and I would like to support those development efforts in strategically appropriate locations.

While I have intimate knowledge of both the public and private sector needs from an Urban Renewal Authority, my personal intention is fairly straight forward and without specific agenda. The business community benefits from knowledgeable staff, appropriate incentives, and a transparent, predictable incentive review process. The City benefits from utilizing incentives as strategic 'last dollar' contributions to ensure community benefits and strategic outcomes are achieved in development. I feel I have unique experience to speak to both sides of these public-private partnerships to ensure a fair and equitable development results from URA participation, and build community trust in the URA and the development process with appropriate education and outreach efforts.

I want to help ensure that development spurred by the festival truly benefits the people of Boulder, especially those with less deep pockets, who have a long history of being overlooked or displaced by processes of urban renewal.

I have a PhD in City and Regional Planning with a focus on urban design and transportation systems from the University of California, Berkeley. Much of my research has investigated community livability and walkability. While I feel like I know so many of our civic leaders and members of staff from all the video recordings and meetings I've watched over the years, I realize that few of these individuals know me. I'd like to take a brief opportunity to introduce myself.

As a 20 year resident of the community, I've set deep roots here. I've owned and operated a tree care business which served residential, commercial, and municipal customers. But most importantly, I served the trees... the urban canopy, which I consider to be one of Boulder's most valuable, yet under-appreciated community assets. Over the years, I've had the privilege of developing a broad personal network of community leaders, city staff, and engaged citizens. Social conversations regularly take a civic turn, and oftentimes friends ask 'what's the latest' or they'll share their thoughts and I'm always interested in learning their perspectives and concerns regarding the city. Additionally, I know the fabric of the city exceptionally well. I know all the nooks and crannies and often know the history of how things came to be.

To answer the question of 'Why?,' I've often contemplated taking a more formal role in civic engagement and the opportunity to serve on BURA seems like a great fit for taking this next step. The rising number of empty storefronts and offices on and around Pearl Street concerns me deeply, and I want to contribute to practical solutions.

My qualifications mainly come from both professional experience and simply living my daily life in Boulder. As an Emergency Physician practicing in the Denver-Boulder area, I am trained to look beyond immediate symptoms to understand root causes and to make evidence-based decisions. I have worked in government systems, tribal health settings, and both rural and urban hospitals, experiences that have strengthened my ability to work constructively within groups to evaluate complex situations.

My approach emphasizes evidence-based analysis, collaborative problem-solving, and practical implementation. I believe these skills translate directly to the work of evaluating redevelopment proposals, understanding market dynamics, and making decisions that serve Boulder's long-term interests.

While I have not worked directly with BURA, I have engaged with the issues central to its mission. As a Boulder resident concerned about downtown vitality, I have spent a considerable amount of time understanding the mechanics behind commercial vacancy rates and the forces driving the changing shape of downtown.

I have also followed the city's broader efforts in this space, including the launch of the new Cultural and Economic Development division, the expansion of the business opportunity program, and the upcoming Downtown Development Authority. Understanding how BURA fits within this ecosystem of economic development tools has shaped my thinking about what approaches might actually move the needle.

I see how community spaces, walkable districts, and local business environments affect people's sense of connection and wellbeing. A downtown that works well for residents, workers, and visitors is one that works well for Boulder as a whole.

If appointed, I hope to bring fresh thinking and practical analysis to BURA's work on downtown revitalization. I aim to contribute rigorous evaluation of proposals grounded in facts, data, and an understanding of the structural constraints that make commercial vacancy and public safety such a persistent challenge.

Specifically, I want to help the board think creatively about reducing friction for businesses willing to take a chance on Boulder. This means examining how BURA's tools can complement other city efforts around permitting modernization, transparency in vacancy information, and coordination with the new Downtown Development Authority. I believe addressing long-term vacancies and improving urban vitality is a solvable problem if we focus on clearer information and better coordination between stakeholders.

I also hope to learn from fellow board members, city staff, and community stakeholders. I value collaborative deliberation and believe that effective urban renewal requires understanding diverse perspectives, from property owners navigating loan constraints to entrepreneurs seeking affordable space to residents who want a downtown that feels vibrant and connected.

Finally, I want to ensure that BURA's decisions reflect a long-term vision for Boulder that shapes how people move through the city, where they gather, and how connected they feel to one another.

This is evident in the city council's actions, including pursuing a 15-minute walkable city and expanding transit options. It's exciting to see a city working to improve this part of the city. I want to be part of making that ambition a reality for every Boulder resident.

The relevant experiences I have for the position include a master's in public policy, a stint on the parks and recreation commission for the city of Bloomington from 2016 to 2020, and an internship with the NWRDC (Northwest Regional Development Commission) in Minnesota. I've also served on other boards, including the DFL (Democratic-Farmer-Labor Party) Executive Committee. These experiences have prepared me to be an effective leader and commissioner for this body.

I do not, but have been on a government commission before in the city of Bloomington, Minnesota, where I served on the Parks and Recreation commission. I helped advise and approve long-delayed capital improvement projects, such as redeveloping over 40 parks and playgrounds, designing a community center, and improving bike and trail infrastructure in the city. Along with that, my Master's in Public Policy focused on Economic Development and Government, along with my internship with NWRDC, where I helped them develop housing recommendations to keep the small and medium-sized cities in the region thriving and successful for the future.

3. If appointed, what do you hope to achieve through your service on this board/commission?

There are 4 things that I would want to achieve for this position if appointed.

Urban Infill

We all know that Boulder is a wonderful city with a population that is growing at a rapid pace. While ensuring that this growth does not continue to fuel urban sprawl, it is also important to recognize the areas around town that are in need of redevelopment. This is important because it gives us the chance to maximize the use of the land we already have, while also ensuring that we do not displace affordable housing, since the region is in a crunch for affordable housing.

Small Business Development

Boulder, like any other city, has businesses of different sizes, but what stands out in the city of Boulder is how many small businesses it has. It is of utmost importance for the city to do everything in its power to keep developing the small business sector and keep the small businesses that are already here thriving. Small business is the backbone of any community, and when they are growing, your economy and quality of life as a community thrive as well. I would want to ensure that we are keeping those small businesses in any way possible from going under, moving, and along with giving them opportunities to grow.

Missing Middle Development.

As Boulder expands, the city still has traditional options for expansion, such as development in the rural tracts of land around us. Even though there is great growth there, we need to keep the development and growth of the city center. This can be done by maximizing our efforts to see where we can expand housing without taking up more land. This can be achieved through various methods, but focusing on Missing Middle Development is also crucial for maintaining the character of Boulder without altering what residents perceive as Boulder in terms of its physical environment.

Multimodal transportation.

Boulder already exemplifies this transportation system. The city has bus routes, bike lanes, and pedestrian pathways. I think it is still most important to keep expanding and maintaining what we have to keep that quality of options to get around the city, while also looking for new and innovative solutions to keep Boulder moving and connecting Boulder to the broader region just beyond the city's borders.

In essence, if we want people to still call Boulder home and to move here, we need to focus on making sure we are fully utilizing our built-up environment through accessible transportation, Missing Middle Development, urban infill, and small business development.

After five years of serving on Housing Advisory Board (four years as chair; term ending March 2026), I seek to stay involved in Boulder's planning and development issues at this key juncture. I'm especially intrigued by continuing efforts at Boulder Junction and the possibility of Boulder creating a Downtown Development Authority (DDA). Although not trained as an architect, developer, urban planner or real estate professional, I served for 17 years as executive director of Urban Land Institute (ULI) Colorado, the state's top nonprofit addressing land use issues.

During this time I organized 70+ Technical Advisory Panels (TAPs) in Colorado, including several in Boulder at such key sites as Diagonal Plaza and what eventually became the new Limelight Hotel. In that time I developed at least a working laity knowledge in such areas as urban renewal tools (blight studies, TIF, etc), public finance mechanisms, transit-oriented development (TOD), and public-private partnerships. In addition I have written/edited many articles and several books on urban development, which has granted me access to many leaders in this field as well insider looks at key redevelopment sites in the US, Canada, and Europe.

I have been a guest lecturer/critic in numerous urban planning and architecture classes at CU (Boulder and Denver).

In 2022, the nonprofit Create Boulder hired me to conduct a feasibility workshop for a potential multi-purpose arts center. I assembled and chaired a panel of experts who worked with 200+ city officials, arts organizations and community members to create a workshop, study, and report focused on the potential of four different sites in Boulder. Since then I volunteered to start a Create Boulder facilities committee that seeks to be a catalyst for improved arts facilities including performance and movie space, studios, galleries, artist housing, and more.

Recently I joined the Urban Design Advisory Council, a group of leading architects and developers that seeks to advance quality architecture and urban design in Denver.

In addition, I am about to join the board of Historic Boulder Inc. In the 1970s and 80s, I worked for the National Trust for Historic Preservation. Since then I have continued my longstanding interest in historic buildings and sites.

I would like to serve on BURA to have a positive influence on key redevelopments in our city. I can be an effective advocate for redevelopments that serve a broad range of our residents and contribute to the aesthetics of our buildings, streetscapes, and landscapes, and of course to our economic and social vitality.

I served on BURA in the early 2000s when the city was working with Macerich to redevelop Crossroads Mall as 29th Street. I advocated (unsuccessfully) for a more "urban" development with greater density, less surface parking, better urban design, and much more housing.

I plan to exert a positive influence on continued development at Boulder Junction and strategic future developments downtown. I would plan to advocate for practical financing and economic outcomes; more (and a greater variety of) housing; the inclusion of arts and cultural spaces in development and redevelopment; and quality architecture, landscape architecture and urban design.

As I mentioned in my response to question 2, I was disappointed in the redevelopment at 29th Street. While the project serves its purpose (tax base, services like Home Depot, clothing stores, and movie theaters), it is clearly not up to the standard of economic vitality, architecture, urban design, and progressive land use that Boulder deserves and should insist upon.

I recognize that "quality" in urban development is both subjective and hard to define. I also realize that BURA does not function as a design review board. The bottom line is I would speak up for the best quality developments Boulder can attain.

I have not had previous experience with the DMC other than viewing videos of past meetings, and reading the materials available on the City website about the Commission and its portfolio. Even before relocating to downtown Boulder, my husband and I had made connections with a variety local business owners and staff. Through the background research I have done to learn more about the commission and the work underway, I believe many of the skills I developed and experiences I have had resonate well with the work of the DMC. I want to give back to the Boulder community I call home and serving on the Environmental Advisory Board serves that goal. Additionally, I value the positive impact of science informed policy and wholeheartedly believe that engineers and scientists like myself should be engaged in serving their community by providing their specific skills and data based reasoning applied towards such efforts. This aligns particularly with Walter Orr Roberts intentions when founding NCAR wherein scientists have a responsibility to bridge science and societal interests and to inform and engage in public policy decision-making.

I specifically am qualified to serve on the Environmental Advisory Board given my long term experience and engagement with environmental concerns both in the technical science space and the societal space. As for my technical background, I studied atmospheric dynamics and linkages of monsoonal systems to societal adaptation practices during graduate school, while also gaining broad knowledge across many additional areas of concern including renewable energy and environmental pollution management. Though today I generally support the computational needs of my science peers at NCAR, I continue to learn from many of the world experts who visit and engage with the NCAR community. As for my societal skills, I have regularly volunteered with local organizations that focus on environmental issues, including 350.org and was recently also elected as an incoming co-chair of the Indian Peaks Group Sierra Club Executive Committee.

2. Have you had any experience(s) with this Board or the services it oversees?

I have given public comments on past issues including framing housing policy as climate policy as well as sharing relevant wildfire risk and WUI research with city elected officials and staff. I have also volunteered for some Play Boulder programming focusing on environmental stewardship efforts such as tree planting and supporting group trail hikes and ecological education.

More specific to this board, I've given feedback on the city Climate Action Plan via standard feedback mechanisms but beyond reviewing occasional EAB meeting packets, I have admittedly not have had significant impact on EAB directly via it public comments or similar at their meetings.

3. If appointed, what do you hope to achieve through your service on this board/commission?

I hope to focus one priority of EAB's efforts this year on wildfire resilience and better understanding of both the problem and the solutions towards managing WUI exposure and disaster risk. Most important to that process is to simultaneously highlight the convergence of wildfire risk with many other issues, including agriculture and soil health, urban planning design choices, and building materials. With this attention paid towards wildfire risk and adaptation needs, especially prioritizing at risk lower income communities, I aim to foster the collaboration needed across our city advisory boards and staff departments to creatively pursue solutions to wildfire resilience. The risk from wildfires will only increase with time and our city must address this problem together.

In addition to focusing on wildfire risk, I would like to consider supporting community programs which nurture a community stewardship for nature. Whether it's biking outside, starting a community garden, or learning about nature through OSMP rangers, I would like to see EAB assess and amplify these programs for many more Boulder residents to benefit from, towards the end goal where those same residents are empowered as new Earth stewards for our shared environment.

I grew up in Kentucky. It's not usually the first place people think of when they picture "environmental action". For much of my life, I often felt like the only environmentalist in the room. I eventually realized that this isn't because Kentuckians are indifferent, but because many still remember when coal was not only the most affordable and reliable energy option, but also the biggest employer in town. People like to stick with what has worked in the past to keep the lights on, even if it's less effective today. As I've gotten older, I've learned that the most effective conversations about environmental issues begin by grounding them within people's lived realities. By emphasizing solutions that align sustainability goals with community priorities, I've developed an approach to environmental problem-solving that is empathetic, solutions-oriented, and collaborative.

It's this mindset, my commitment to advancing environmental progress in the Boulder community, and my academic and professional experiences that motivate me to serve on Boulder's Environmental Advisory Board. Throughout my undergraduate years at Centre College, I gained extensive experience in sustainability and environmental governance. I was elected by Centre faculty to serve as the sole student representative on the College's Sustainability Committee. For two years, I helped identify long-term goals and actions the College could integrate into their 10-Year Master Plan for Development. Our work ultimately led to sustainability being adopted as one of the plan's core pillars.

Outside of the Committee, I co-founded Centre's first Office of Sustainability alongside my professor, where I served as the main student liaison and conducted benchmarking research on peer institutions to identify sustainability best practices. One focus of my research was dining services, and after I graduated, the College transitioned to a provider known for its strong sustainability performance. I also sat on the Green Revolving Fund board, reviewing student proposals and evaluating which projects would provide meaningful environmental benefits to the campus as a whole.

Outside of academia, I worked as the Communications Coordinator for the Louisville Sustainability Council (LSC) in my hometown of Louisville, Kentucky. I regularly attended, facilitated, and served as secretary at the LSC's board meetings and retreats. This work gave me a strong understanding of board procedures, consensus-building, agenda-setting, and strategic planning. I later served on the Solarize Louisville board as a representative for both the LSC and Solar Energy Solutions. In this role, I provided customized solar quotes for program participants, developed outreach materials, and tracked weekly performance metrics to present at each board meeting.

More recently, my work as a Colorado Resilience Engine (CORE) intern with the City of Louisville (Colorado) strengthened my

understanding of local government operations along the Front Range. I presented my deliverables to the Louisville Sustainability Advisory Board and attended several of their meetings, which gave me firsthand experience with board dynamics and community-driven decision-making. In this role, I also worked on a wide range of sustainability initiatives, such as rebate program design, emergency preparedness outreach, interdepartmental coordination, website accessibility, and water conservation. I now have a much greater understanding of how to move environmental projects from concept to implementation within local government.

As a current graduate student at CU Boulder specializing in Environmental & Energy Policy, I also bring graduate-level technical knowledge and a fresh perspective on issues ranging from natural resource management and sustainable to renewable energy systems and utility regulation.

Relocating to Boulder from Kentucky has given me an invaluable dual perspective. I've worked in communities where environmental progress has depended on incredibly persistent coalition-building, and I now live in a place where sustainability is deeply woven into the local identity. This contrast has strengthened my ability to communicate across viewpoints and bring people together on progressive yet pragmatic solutions. Boulder has quickly become home for me, and I'm eager to contribute to the city that has inspired me since I was 14 and first becoming an environmental advocate. I hope to serve on the Board as a dedicated, thoughtful, and collaborative community representative.

2. Have you had any experience(s) with this Board or the services it oversees?

While I haven't yet attended an Environmental Advisory Board meeting, I'm familiar with municipal board processes through regularly attending the City of Louisville's Sustainability Advisory Board meetings this semester.

I've worked in multiple areas relevant to the Board, including helping develop communications for Louisville's upcoming Eco-Cycle voucher program and conducting research on turf-conversion and pesticide-free practices in partnership with Boulder staff.

My strongest background is in energy and green buildings. At CU Boulder, I've taken coursework in energy systems, utility regulation, and geothermal/thermal networks, and I'm completing my Capstone with Denver's Office of Climate Action on neighborhood-scale electrification under HB 24-1370. I also led the winning team in DOE's 2024 Geothermal Collegiate Competition and am working toward a LEED certification this upcoming spring.

Professionally, my work with Solar Energy Solutions and the Solarize Louisville bulk-purchase program gave me hands-on experience with solar adoption and outreach. My earliest exposure to environmental issues came through air-quality challenges in my hometown of Louisville, Kentucky, which motivated my continued work in this field.

I haven't yet had any experiences with the Board itself, but I'd welcome the opportunity to attend a meeting and submit a public comment as a Boulder resident. This past semester, much of my time was dedicated to attending and presenting my findings at the City of Louisville's Sustainability Advisory Board (LSAB) meetings. While this isn't directly related to Boulder's Environmental Advisory Board, the LSAB meetings enhanced my understanding of how municipal boards operate and the kinds of issues they routinely address.

I do, however, have experience with many of the services and topic areas the Boulder Environmental Advisory Board oversees. Most recently, I supported the City of Louisville's Sustainability Specialist in preparing for the launch of a new Eco-Cycle voucher program. I helped develop communications materials for its 2026 rollout and figure out how to transition the initiative from a single-day event to an ongoing voucher program that increases accessibility for residents.

I have the strongest academic and professional background in energy and green building. At CU Boulder, I've taken extensive coursework in energy systems and building modeling, utility regulation, and non-pipeline alternatives, and I'm particularly interested in geothermal energy and thermal energy networks. I'm currently completing my Capstone with Denver's Office of Climate Action, Sustainability, and Resiliency (CASR), where I've been conducting research over the past year to support Denver's role as a gas planning pilot community under HB 24-1370. I also

served as Captain of the winning team in the U.S. Department of Energy's 2024 Geothermal Collegiate Competition. This spring, I will be taking a greenhouse gas accounting course and pursuing my LEED certification, for which I've already begun studying.

Professionally, my work with Solar Energy Solutions and the Solarize Louisville bulk-purchase program has given me hands-on experience in residential solar adoption and bulk purchasing programs. All of these experiences have provided me with a strong foundation in the decarbonization space.

In the area of integrated pest management, I consulted with a City of Boulder representative during my internship at the City of Louisville. I reached out to multiple municipalities across Colorado to conduct research on non-residential turf-conversion programs. Her insights on avoiding pesticide use in non-functional turf removal informed my final recommendations to the City of Louisville, which emphasized more natural and ecologically sensitive approaches.

My earliest exposure to the environmental field as a whole came through air quality issues I observed in my hometown of Louisville, Kentucky. As an undergraduate, I conducted research on these challenges, as there are many chemical plants that reside near low-income and disadvantaged residential neighborhoods.

3. If appointed, what do you hope to achieve through your service on this board/commission?

If appointed, I hope to contribute meaningfully to Boulder's climate goals, supporting the city in achieving its target of reducing greenhouse gas emissions 70% from the 2019 baseline by 2030. I believe reaching this goal will require cross-departmental and cross-board coordination, as well as regional collaboration with other municipalities. During my internship with the City of Louisville, I created a matrix of water conservation programs across Colorado and conducted over 15 interviews with local government staff. Many of these contacts had not spoken to one another before, so I shared the matrix with interviewees to facilitate knowledge exchange and learning between municipalities, an experience that strengthened my understanding of the value of information-sharing.

I also hope to contribute to Boulder's work on climate resilience, adaptation, and emergency planning. This past September, I helped organize National Disaster Preparedness Month in Louisville, developing campaign themes, coordinating workshops and community events, and connecting resilience messaging back to the City's broader sustainability initiatives. These experiences revealed to me the importance of integrating preparedness and adaptation into environmental sustainability planning.

At the same time, I'm committed to advancing environmental initiatives that are equitable and grounded in the realities of Boulder's high cost of living. In my Capstone with Denver's Office of Climate Action, Sustainability, and Resiliency (CASR), I explored how neighborhood-scale electrification can be implemented in low-income and disadvantaged communities, including renter neighborhoods, in ways that maximize benefits without exacerbating housing or energy costs. I believe truly sustainable environmental action must be environmentally, socially, and economically sustainable. If we don't hit all three of these pillars, then the initiative isn't truly sustainable. I want to help Boulder marry these two goals.

Lastly, I'm committed to amplifying the perspectives of students, renters, and younger residents, groups who are often underrepresented on boards, so that Boulder's environmental future reflects the full breadth of its community members.

The City of Boulder exemplifies how local governments can lead sustainable change, especially with current limitations at the federal level. I believe now is a crucial time for local governments to demonstrate how climate and environmental action can enhance residents' local economies, health, and livelihoods, and I want to be part of this effort. Currently, most of my work focuses on climate action planning and developing decarbonization strategies. . Being on the Environmental Advisory Board would allow me to support my community more directly and apply the skills I've gained from projects outside Colorado, bringing them back home. I want to help develop scalable solutions tailored to our community. Boulder's values and initiatives speak volumes, and I would be honored to serve the community in this role.

I bring strong technical knowledge in sustainability and practical experience across local government policy, community engagement, and project implementation. My experience aligns closely with the City of Boulder's priorities, particularly in energy, buildings, zero-waste practices, and procurement. I have supported circular economy and capacity-building initiatives with ICLEI USA, built decarbonization and resilience policy with Building Power Resource Center (BPRC), and supported hyper-local wildfire resilience projects with the Four Corners Carbon Coalition.

Below are the skills and sustainability topics that I can contribute to the Environmental Advisory Board:

Building decarbonization and community co-creation: I've served residents and community groups through my roles at BPRC. BPRC is a national resource hub that helps community organizations and local governments access federal funds for innovative climate policies. During my time there, I supported a public housing decarbonization pilot in Allegheny County, in partnership with two coalitions and tenant leaders. I facilitate meetings with the tenant council president to listen to tenant concerns (air quality, energy outages, and costs), and co-develop solutions that align with sustainability goals. We developed a project that addresses resident needs, weatherizes the building, and decarbonizes it. I plan to bring my understanding of tenant needs and priorities to my role as a board member.

Energy modeling for decarbonization: Through my Masters of the Environment degree at CU Boulder, with a focus on Renewable and Sustainable Energy, I completed Scope 1 and 2 GHG inventories, building energy modeling, EUI calculations, and financial analysis for decarbonization projects. I also researched 100% electric building policies, analyzing a range of laws upheld in court, including zero-emission standards for space and water

heaters, building appliance regulations, and all-electric building codes. I aim to use my expertise in systems, energy, and policy to support decarbonization efforts with the City of Boulder.

Climate Action Plan Implementation: I conducted a statewide analysis and authored a white paper on 22 Climate Action Plans (CAPs) across Minnesota with support from local coalitions: 100% and Unidos. My analysis evaluates how local governments support neighborhood-scale sustainability projects. I assessed key resilience aspects, including vulnerability assessments, environmental justice and cumulative impacts, emergency preparedness, adaptive capacity planning, resilience of municipal operations and infrastructure, the use of natural infrastructure, and cross-jurisdictional relationships. The insights from my research could help guide Boulder's policy development to expand scalable, replicable neighborhood resilience.

Sustainable procurement and circularity: At ICLEI USA, I co-developed and co-led the Sustainable and Circular Procurement Cohort for 25 local governments, including our front-range neighbors Lakewood and Englewood, while also providing one-on-one technical support to their sustainability staff. I'd like to apply my knowledge to ensure that Boulder's procurement goals align with climate and equity outcomes, economic growth, and social benefits.

I am drawn to the EAB board because it combines public service, community advocacy, technical sustainability expertise, and holistic thinking. I would be excited to bring my experience in local government sustainability to support a thriving community for its members. Thank you for your time and consideration.

Previously, as CEO of ISET-International based here in Boulder, I managed multi-million dollar programs helping Asian and African cities understand how climate hazards propagate across interconnected urban systems.

What I bring is a systems thinking approach. From reviewing the board's 2025 work, I see Boulder has strong holistic framing through the SER framework, whole-of-government Climate Action Plan approach, and cascading risk modeling, alongside detailed sector-level work on wildfire, water, grid reliability, and individual site reviews. My career has focused on keeping systems-level thinking present while working on sector and project implementation, helping decision-makers see how specific actions connect to broader resilience goals.

I understand the board's role is to advise, not direct. I'm comfortable working collaboratively and helping translate technical complexity into clear recommendations that Council can act on.

2. Have you had any experience(s) with this Board or the services it oversees?

I have not attended EAB meetings, but I have reviewed the full year of 2025 meeting packets and recordings to understand the board's current priorities and how it operates.

I have direct experience with the substantive areas the board oversees. On climate action, I spent four years as USAID's Senior Climate Specialist coordinating integration across government programs, work that parallels Boulder's whole-of-government approach. On waste, I'm currently supporting the development of a forest waste-to-soil carbon project here in Boulder. On water, my international work focused on urban water resilience and flood management, and I hold an MSc in Earth Sciences from CU Boulder with research at INSTAAR. On cascading risks, my work in Asian cities explicitly modeled how climate hazards propagate across interconnected urban systems.

I'm familiar with the board's recent letter to Council advocating for a food systems position, the discussions around landscape codes and firewise requirements, and the updates to the Climate Action Plan that staff presented in November.

3. If appointed, what do you hope to achieve through your service on this board/commission? I hope to contribute in three ways.

First, I want to help the board maintain a systems perspective as it advises on sector-specific and project-level work. Boulder has strong holistic framing through the SER framework and the whole-of-government approach to the Climate Action Plan, alongside necessary sector-specific work on wildfire, water, buildings, and grid reliability. My experience coordinating across sectors can help the board keep asking how a specific policy or project connects to broader resilience goals, whether it addresses cascading risks, and whether it advances multiple SER outcomes simultaneously.

Second, I want to support the board's continued engagement with resilience planning. The 2024 letter to Council called for relaunching the Resilience Strategy, and I bring direct professional expertise in this area. I can help the board think through how social and financial resilience connect to physical infrastructure hardening, and how to frame resilience recommendations that are actionable within Council's work plan.

Third, I want to be a collaborative and prepared board member who does the homework, listens to fellow members and staff, and helps translate technical complexity into clear recommendations. I'm not coming in with a personal agenda. I want to learn, support the board's collective work, and help Council make well-informed decisions.

I have experience developing affordable housing, rigorously evaluating housing interventions for vulnerable populations, and supporting public and private agencies in creating and testing strategies to promote housing stability and other positive outcomes for individuals and families. As a member of the board and leadership team of a local housing organization, TGTHR, I was directly involved in the conceptualization, planning, financing, and implementation of supportive housing developments in Boulder and Denver. These efforts included identifying suitable locations for redevelopment, negotiating and collaborating with private developers and government agencies, reviewing financial projections and pro-formas, and securing public and private funding for development costs and supportive services for residents. I am writing to express my sincere interest in being reappointed to the Boulder Housing Partners Commission for a second term. Serving on the Board has been an immensely meaningful experience for me, both personally and professionally. I have grown significantly during my first term, and I remain deeply committed to supporting BHP's mission and the residents we serve.

My commitment to this work is rooted in my own lived experience. I grew up in public housing, which was my initial attraction to volunteering on this commission. I know firsthand what it means to have a place to call home and to create community in such an environment. My single mother raised three daughters there, and we all became engaged, responsible citizens - shaped in part by the sense of community we were part of in "the projects." While BHP is a far cry from the housing I grew up in, especially in terms of aesthetics, the core truth remains unchanged: having a safe place to lay our heads at night, surrounded by loving neighbors, grounded us. That understanding continues to guide my service and fuels my dedication to this work.

One of the greatest privileges of my first term has been the opportunity to work alongside BHP's extraordinary staff. I wish to serve on the Housing Advisory Board to apply my background in complex regulatory policy, public interest law, and legislative drafting to one of Boulder's most critical challenges: ensuring accessible, safe, and sustainable housing. As a resident of Boulder and a legal professional with extensive experience in both the public and private sectors, I want to contribute to the rigorous analysis and stakeholder consensus required to shape effective housing policy for our community.

My qualifications for this position are rooted in a career spent navigating high-stakes regulatory environments and advocating for public welfare. Currently, as Corporate Counsel at Google in Boulder, I manage complex compliance initiatives and lead cross-functional stakeholder groups to develop company-wide policy. This role requires balancing competing interests and translating intricate regulations into practical operational guidance. Previously, while working at a litigation firm in Seattle, I drafted legislation enacted by the City of Puyallup to more humanely address homelessness, giving me firsthand insight into the legislative process and the nuances of municipal housing crises.

Prior to my time in the private sector, I spent most of my career in the public sector, serving as an Assistant Attorney General for the State of Washington (Complex Litigation Division) and as a trial attorney at the U.S. Department of Justice Environment & Natural Resources Division. These roles provided me with direct experience in housing-related legal matters. As an environmental crimes prosecutor at the DOJ, I led a first-in-the-nation investigation into lead paint and toxic substance regulations, securing a guilty plea from a large real estate developer for safety violations. This experience underscored the vital importance of enforcing housing standards to protect vulnerable tenants.

Later, as an Assistant Attorney General, I successfully opposed challenges that threatened millions of dollars in tax revenue for public transit and defended state agencies in complex litigation affecting millions of residents. I also litigated to protect state tax revenue from diversion toward an unauthorized border wall and helped the state navigate challenging policy questions as counsel for the Governor in COVID-19 related litigation.

I have been interested in housing supply issues for several years. Prior to moving to Boulder, I lived for two years in San Francisco, where I was an active member of YIMBY Action and YIMBY Law. I am currently on the board of the Orchard Creek Homeowner's Association in Boulder.

I hold a J.D. cum laude from Harvard Law School and a B.A. from

Stanford University. After law school I clerked on the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals - the nation's largest court of appeals - where I My combination of high-level policy strategy, legislative drafting experience, and a proven track record of protecting public interests positions me to be an effective and analytical member of the Housing Advisory Board.

I have not previously served on the Housing Advisory Board. However, my professional background directly parallels the core services and oversight functions the Board provides.

I understand the Board's primary role is to advise the City Council on housing policy, recommend funding priorities (such as CDBG and Affordable Housing Funds), and assess the impact of city policies on affordability. While I have not sat on this specific body, I have performed these exact functions in other capacities:

Policy & Ordinance Development: The Board is tasked with recommending ordinances to address housing needs. As a private attorney, I drafted municipal legislation to address homelessness which was enacted by the City of Puyallup. This gave me direct experience in the granular work of translating housing goals into enforceable city code.

Oversight of Housing Standards: The Board monitors housing quality and safety. As a DOJ trial attorney, I led a major investigation into lead paint safety violations, enforcing federal housing standards to protect tenants, as well as a major investigation into mishandling of asbestos at a 400,000 facility in New York. I understand how to make housing safety regulations effective.

Fiscal Stewardship: The Board recommends how to allocate limited housing funds. My experience defending state tax revenues and managing complex compliance frameworks has prepared me to rigorously evaluate funding proposals and ensure public resources are deployed effectively.

Additionally, as a current board member of the Orchard Creek HOA, I am already serving in a governance role that requires managing community housing assets and building consensus among residents.

3. If appointed, what do you hope to achieve through your service on this board/commission?

If appointed, I hope to translate my professional background in regulatory analysis and legislative drafting into concrete, actionable improvements for Boulder's housing ecosystem. My goal is to help the Board provide the City Council with recommendations that are not only aspirational but legally sound and operationally viable.

Specifically, I hope to achieve three outcomes:

1. Practical Solutions for Housing Supply & Affordability

I want to use my experience in complex regulatory frameworks to help the Board identify specific, code-level adjustments that reduce friction in the housing creation process. My objective is to support policies that encourage 'missing middle' and workforce housing, ensuring that Boulder remains accessible to the teachers, firefighters, and service workers who sustain our community. I believe we can make meaningful progress on affordability by focusing on data-driven updates to our zoning and approval processes.

2. Humane and Effective Approaches to Homelessness

Drawing on my direct experience drafting municipal legislation to address homelessness in Washington state, I hope to help the Board recommend policies that balance compassion with public safety and efficacy. I want to ensure that our strategies for the unhoused are grounded in what has been proven to work legally and practically in similar jurisdictions.

3. Rigorous, Consensus-Based Governance

Finally, I want to foster a culture of rigorous analysis. Whether we are discussing CDBG allocations or inclusionary housing requirements, I hope to ensure our recommendations are stress-tested and built on broad stakeholder consensus. My goal is to be a board member who listens to all sides of an issue and then applies a technical lens to find the most reasonable, sustainable path forward.

Growing up in Boulder, the people you met working at the grocery store, coffee shop, or at a restaurant more often than not lived in the neighborhood or across town. Gradually over the years as property values have risen, more and more people working or going to school in Boulder have had to go farther and farther a field to find affordable housing. Boulder has made progress in supporting more affordable housing for low- and middle-income residents. I have the experience and background to support and contribute to the Housing Advisory Board's evaluation of new affordable housing proposals, strategies, policies and evaluating the effectiveness of existing approaches to meet community needs.

I wish to serve on the housing board to progress the cause of affordable housing in our city and our region (I mentioned the latter as housing in Boulder impacts the adjacent markets and vice versa). The excessive pricing of housing in our city and beyond is a grave matter of economic injustice, severely curtailing opportunity for the younger and the less affluent. In addition housing and its patterns of development are important issues for the climate, and, given the strain of economic mobility caused by the cost of housing, it is even a vital political issue.

I have been a local political activist on the topic of housing, volunteering on local election campaigns and serving on the board of Better Boulder. I also work in the field of sustainability in my job at the SPIKE Center for Sustainability at CU Boulder, where sustainable housing is among the topics we address. I have experience on governing boards, having served on the Board of Directors of Kapost, a local digital marketing startup. I founded the company, served as CEO, and led the company to a successful sale, serving on the Board for the full 10 years of the company's existence.

2. Have you had any experience(s) with this Board or the services it oversees?

I have never interacted directly with the Housing Advisory Board. Nevertheless I have interacted with the city's housing services in various ways having been a homeowner in Boulder for more than 15 years.

3. If appointed, what do you hope to achieve through your service on this board/commission?

I would hope to contribute to significant improvement in housing affordability in Boulder. I would hope to do so both through internally and externally oriented service on the board.

In terms of internal service, the Board's function is to provide thoughtful research, review, and interaction with board meeting attendees in order to provide insight to the city government and council. In this function I would hope to utilize my housing activism, Board service experience, and sustainability background towards becoming a productive HAB member that helps the board produce value support for the city government and council around housing.

Externally, the issue of housing could benefit from engaging a much larger portion of our community than the relatively few who actively engage today. I believe that my marketing and digital experience could be helpful in reaching out to the community about HAB and housing with the intention of generating more participation and input. In particular the voices of the young and of renters need more amplification in our housing dialog, and my digital marketing background and connections with CU Boulder could assist in this goal. Additionally, these outreach skills could be helpful in building connections with other entities beyond our city, such as state and (other) local governments.

In addition to engaging the community around core housing affordability issues, there is an opportunity to better connect with our neighbors around how patterns of housing and development impact upon our quality of life. In particular the recent work from the city around 15 minute neighborhoods provides a superb opportunity to effect social connection, walkability and health. I would also hope to utilize my marketing and communication capabilities to better connect and engage with the community around such issues at the nexus of housing and quality of life.

I have a Master's in Social Work focused on Social and Economic Development Policy and many years of experience working with public and non-profit entities to improve public engagement, awareness, and process. My day job includes working with jurisdictions throughout the country around homelessness data. One of the things I love about my job is that I get to help public agencies find consensus and keep complicated decisions moving forward. Prior to this role I ran a local non-profit and consulted on housing advocacy. I was often focused on community engagement and dialogue, trying to bring community members together, often with very different viewpoints, and find solutions to problems. Sometimes all we found was a sliver of common ground but that can be enough to get "unstuck". One of the things I am quite proud of is the work I've done around Safe Parking. California has several models for effective Safe Parking programs and in the community I lived in we had a very robust community engagement component. In one circumstance neighbors opposed the site for Safe Parking - largely because of their own fears. I worked with the local police department and with those residents to improve understanding around homelessness, housing insecurity, and crime in order to come to a solution that allowed the project to move forward - and made the neighbors more comfortable. I attribute much of my success in advocacy to the conflict resolution and mediation training I've done throughout my career.

In addition to my professional background, I've been able to have my foot in many worlds throughout my life. I grew up with a single Mom of three in South Florida. My father vacillated between living in places not meant for housing and incarceration. I know what it's like to survive on food stamps and housing insecurity. I also know what it's like to raise my own family in the privileged, upper middle-class life I have now. I think the ability to understand and empathize with diverse backgrounds lends itself to the mission of the Human Relations Commission and would help make me an effective board member.

This year I was able to serve on the Human Services Fund Advisory Committee (HSFAC) and learn more about Boulder's processes, priorities, and the organizations helping to move those priorities forward. Drawing on my experience in community engagement and systems thinking, I would aim to support solutions that are preventative, restorative, and oriented toward long-term community well-being.

Ultimately, I hope my service would help strengthen the Commission as a trusted, ethical, and compassionate body, one that upholds Boulder's values while continuously working to ensure that all residents feel seen, protected, and respected.

The program was called Public Achievement, and during my time in the program, we went to a local Boulder high school (Centaurus High School) and worked with the students over the course of a school year to create community action projects to improve their community. But I don't live in Westminster; I live in Boulder. And having been born and raised in Boulder, as well as having gone to college here, Boulder is the city I know and love the most. From still having connections with college professors, to volunteer coaching a softball team with elementary schoolers, to having friends my own age (early-mid 20s), to visiting my grandma in her retirement home in Boulder, I have connections here that span all walks of life. All of these relationships are what make Boulder feel like a home and not just a location I happen to live in.

Additionally, I love talking to and getting to know people. For example, this past fall, I worked with Boulder County and helped conduct a 5 year study about how to improve parks and open space, and I surveyed over 100 different people about their thoughts. I loved getting to talk with people and learn their thoughts on how to improve our open space. And I would love getting to talk with people from all walks of life to learn their stories, and how we can use their lived experiences to work with community members to make Boulder the best place to live that it can be.

Our efforts led to the Astrodome receiving State Antiquities Landmark status.

More recently, I completed a five-year term on Boulder's Transportation Advisory Board, during which I identified opportunities for more efficient planning and spending, and was the architect of the city's Core Arterial Network (CAN) strategic plan.

I have lived in Boulder County and City of Boulder most of my life, so for 60+ years, and have seen the open Space program expand under Jim Crain who I knew and worked with on many occasions. I have been an open space advocate and user my entire life. As a professional scientist I work around the world on complex ecological problems and have focused my work on natural areas, particularly national parks. I did many research and consulting projects with Jim Crain and other Open Space staff for many years in the 1980s and 90s and have testified at a few Open Space meetings and met with the current director and staff on issues about Open Space in south Boulder. As mentioned above I served a full term on the Parks Board and learned a lot about how such boards work with the director, staff and council.

Another emerging topic is the use of mountain bikes on trails particularly in south Boulder, that will require considerable thought and action. Fencing is another topic worthy of discussion where the fences back up to private homes. Open space should be available to use by all, and increasing access in ways other than private cars could be an important discussion topic.

I am interested in getting more involved in local Boulder governance as a way to give back, and I find that my skills and interests align well with the purpose of the Open Space Board of Trustees. As an avid user of Boulder open space, I'm invested in ensuring access to this incredible resource across our community; as an environmentalist, I'm committed to preserving our ecological legacy for future generations; and as a homeowner less than a mile from open space, I'm acutely aware of wildfire risk. I also bring professional expertise in wildfire mitigation strategy and prioritization through my work at Technosylva, where I lead wildfire mitigation planning product development. Technosylva provides wildfire response and mitigation technology for customers including Xcel, the United States Forest Service, and CAL FIRE.

In my current professional role, I am helping develop and roll out an update to our wildfire spread model to better account for behavior within the wildland-urban interface and urban conflagration, a problem fundamental to Boulder. This work will help me inform OSMP wildfire mitigation strategy and engage with the community to build support for these efforts.

Wildfire risk is only increasing, and wind-driven fire events can quickly encroach into the urban environment, spreading miles beyond the flame front through ember cast. Ignition prevention and early spread mitigation are therefore critical to safeguarding our community. OSMP has done excellent work reducing fuels through mechanical thinning and cattle grazing, and has responded to heightened fire risk with smart policies like trail closures during the recent NWS-designated Particularly Dangerous Situation windstorm.

However, more work remains, particularly in the usage of mowing and/or prescribed burns to manage surface fuels. These activities are expensive and risk negative community feedback, but they are some of the most impactful interventions we can make from a wildfire risk management perspective; heightened community engagement and education are therefore necessary. As a wildfire mitigation practitioner who works directly with organizations planning mitigation efforts, I believe I have the experience necessary to both help guide organizational priorities and interface with the community to increase awareness and understanding.

2. Have you had any experience(s) with this Board or the services it oversees?

I recreate on OSMP land daily, whether running in Shanahan Ridge, biking through Boulder Valley Ranch, or hiking Sanitas. Moreover, I experience the services of OSMP every red flag day when wildfire doesn't break out in our community due to the mitigation efforts and closures enforced by this organization.

3. If appointed, what do you hope to achieve through your service on this board/commission?

I hope to further the mission of OSMP by thoughtfully weighing the tradeoffs inherent in its work, including recreational access, ecological protection, and preservation of agricultural heritage. I also want to serve as an effective liaison to the community, gathering input and helping convey the nuances behind organizational decisions. Specifically, my top priorities would be:

- (1) Prioritize effective wildfire mitigation, involving community stakeholders early to address legitimate concerns (e.g., around risk of wildfire escape from prescribed burns) and shape a wildfire mitigation approach that balances risk reduction with ecological health and community safety. Additionally, I'd like to help OSMP adopt technology to better inform wildfire risk and mitigation strategies with a deeper understanding of wildfire spread potential and consequences (population and values at risk), including impact on vulnerable populations.
- (2) Promote ecological health, including through the effective management of invasives, restoration of degraded soil health, and improved management of forests, including by interfacing with the community to promote understanding of the ecology (e.g., the value of cattle grazing to combat tall oat grass, thereby slowing the spread of an invasive weed, reducing wildfire risk, and restoring soil health)
- (3) Expand community engagement and education opportunities, including through direct Board interaction and working with OSMP staff to further deploy physical signage and online/social media content regarding OSMP practices
- (4) Revisit policies and priorities to effectively manage recreational usage patterns, including by reviewing parking lot access and policies, exploring additional transit opportunities similar to the Park-to-Park bus, expanding bike parking at trailheads, ensuring ADA-compliant accessible access, and generally promoting sustainable and equitable usage of our OSMP lands.
- (5) Preserve and further our agricultural heritage, including by expanding cattle grazing where warranted to address wildfire risk and/or improve soil health, expanding programs to promote organic and regenerative agricultural practices on OSMP land, and expanding educational opportunities especially with local schools.

I have lived in and out of Boulder since the 1990s, and my great grandparents and grandfather lived here as well, so the city has been a part of family and life experiences for generations, and I have both a unique perspective, as well as personal investment and interest in the long-term planning for Boulder. Land use codes shape the community and environment we live in. Having witnessed the transition from traditional neighborhoods to today's dense urban blocks, I recognize that cities change over time and that a vibrant Boulder requires a diverse housing spectrum for a diverse population-single-family, townhomes, duplex, and high-density-supported by thoughtful commercial zoning that focuses on community. We especially need to focus on young and middle income families, who are getting priced out of the city. I've witnessed this firsthand with my grade-school children in BVSD and its declining enrollment. Meeting these groups needs ensures the future of Boulder.

Professionally, I have managed operations and strategy for organizations with revenue and budgets exceeding those of the City of Boulder. This experience has taught me how to synthesize complex data, navigate competing stakeholder interests, and execute long-term strategies. I wish to serve because I believe my ability to balance fiscal reality with community-centric growth will ensure Boulder remains accessible and functional for future generations.

2. Have you had any experience(s) with this Board or the services it oversees?

I have not directly been involved with the planning board, but every citizen interacts with and is impacted by the board's decisions. Seeing the changes in Boulder zoning that has happened in the past few years, and watching the city grapple with needed changes to meet the demand for people moving to Boulder has highlighted the need to continue to have thoughtful people on the board. Having watched these meetings, I think that my perspective would be additive to the board.

My first job was in maintenance in my family's multi-family housing developments in Memphis. Over time, I took on a range of roles in operations and management, giving me a deep understanding of the lived experience of residents and housing policy from the ground up, including those of subsidized housing. I'd use that experience to help build the long-term health and smart growth of Boulder as a whole. It is one thing to plan how we want the city to be in the future, and it is another to understand the needs of the residents, how they live, and how these areas are actually managed.

Last, my wife and I have been involved in a remodel in a historic area in Boulder. We have learned a great deal, spoken with lots of other boards, and seen opportunities that can make Boulder better for everyone. Some of these opportunities could be addressed by being on this board, but more importantly, I want to be a part of the solution to making a better Boulder.

3. If appointed, what do you hope to achieve through your service on this board/commission?

My interest in serving on the board is not related to ideology, but comes from a place of service to Boulder. There are three key areas in which I'd like to make progress:

1. Plan for Building Community: In recent surveys in Boulder County and the City of Boulder, one of the top things our community members said is that they feel disconnected and want more community. To build community, we'd need to encompass many elements that are known, and continue to understand new ones. This will be especially important in creating the Boulder Valley Comprehensive Plan. Themes that bubble up in discussions include: public spaces, housing for the "middle", inclusion of diverse populations, local commercial infrastructure, safety and social interaction.
2. Economic Growth: Having the right zoning and development to attract people to the area and having the infrastructure to keep and attract businesses is critical for Boulder's growth. Our area is a leader in sports, technology, all things CU, sciences, aerospace, tourism, and more. To continue to be the place businesses want to grow and remain, I'd want us to understand the requirements to attract and keep these organizations and businesses here, to grow the tax base and provide a healthy, productive economy for all community members.
3. Environmental Impact: Environmental considerations in construction, transportation, biodiversity and land use are critical. Boulder has set some ambitious environmental goals for the community, and the city planning is a critical part of meeting those goals.

I'd like to reinforce the importance of the community. Boulder is the people who live here. Too often, I hear people say that the planning seems to be a black box, rubber-stamps for certain projects, or is controlled by a minority with an agenda. All of those comments are emotional. I'd like to contribute to transparency of the process and help community members feel heard and that their needs are understood.

I would like to serve on PRAB to be part of how decisions are made about Boulder's parks and recreation facilities, and ensure those decisions reflect the needs of families, longtime residents, and everyday users of these community assets. As a longtime Boulder resident and mother of elementary-aged children, I bring lived experience with the City's rec centers, parks, and programs. I want to contribute to shaping a vision for our parks and rec services that is sustainable, equitable, and centered on community needs, especially as we look toward the future of the South Boulder Rec Center and other community facilities.

In recent years, PRAB has played a meaningful role in advancing community-focused outcomes and pushing for policy recommendations to reduce barriers to essential programs. But there are real challenges around balancing rising operating costs and budget shortfalls, evaluating proposed fee changes to maintain services, and guiding long-term funding and capital investment strategies for parks and rec facilities. These issues require thoughtful deliberation, community perspective, and a collaborative approach among residents, Board members, and city staff. I believe I can help the board deliberate, take in staff recommendations, advise staff, listen to the community, and facilitate a community supported direction.

I am uniquely qualified to contribute as an effective Board member because of my professional background and community engagement experience. I am a professional facilitator and trained mediator, skilled at listening to diverse perspectives, fostering constructive discussion, and helping groups navigate complex decisions. These are critical skills for a volunteer advisory board that must balance competing priorities. I hold a Master's degree in environmental policy and think about issues from a systems perspective. I have 20+ years of business consulting experience and can interpret financial, operational, and planning reports, and propose thoughtful recommendations.

I have direct experience with Boulder's civic process, having served as vice chair of the City's Environmental Advisory Board and as a volunteer mediator with the City of Boulder, where I help people navigate community concerns and find common ground. I have also volunteered as a bat monitor and prairie dog monitor for the City.

2. Have you had any experience(s) with this Board or the services it oversees?

I have not served on PRAB, but I have extensive experience with the services it oversees as a 25-year resident of the City of Boulder. I regularly use the City's rec centers, my children participate in City camps, and my family and I frequently use Boulder's parks. These experiences as a resident and a parent help me understand how vital these facilities and programs are to families, youth, and the community. They also inform my perspective on access, affordability, program quality, and the importance of well-maintained, welcoming public spaces.

3. If appointed, what do you hope to achieve through your service on this board/commission?

I care deeply about the long-term sustainability of Boulder's recreation centers and their role as true community hubs. Our rec centers are not just places to work out, they are critical public infrastructure that support physical health, mental well-being, youth development, and social connection across generations. Ensuring they are well-funded, well-maintained, and accessible to all residents is essential to Boulder's quality of life.

The South Boulder Recreation Center, in particular, has enormous potential to better serve the full community. I believe it should be a welcoming, affordable space for all ages, with strong after-school programming for youth, accessible opportunities for seniors, and facilities that meet the expectations residents see at comparable rec centers throughout the Front Range. Affordability is key. Cost should not be a barrier to participation, especially for families and youth who benefit most from consistent access to recreation and structured after-school services.

A high-quality aquatic facility is especially important. The pool should be well-maintained, inviting, and reliably available for lap swimming, lessons, and family use. Aquatics programming serves a wide range of users and is often one of the most visible measures of a rec center's overall health and investment. As a South Boulder resident, I wish our family could benefit from a family friendly pool with amenities like Scott Carpenter, just closer to home.

I am particularly interested in exploring diverse and sustainable funding strategies to support these goals, including partnerships, grants, phased capital investments, and creative approaches that balance fiscal responsibility with long-term community benefit. Thoughtful investment now can reduce future costs, improve user experience, and ensure the South Boulder Recreation Center is modern and well-integrated into the neighborhood it serves.

I would like to join the Parks and Recreation board in order to help the city of Boulder serve the public more effectively and efficiently. Given the dwindling numbers of children in Boulder and the very high cost of living here, I would especially like to ensure that the city continues to provide affordable, enriching experiences for all children in the community.

If selected to join the board, I bring several areas of relevant experience.

First, I regularly conduct surveys, interviews, and focus groups in my work, so I am well-equipped to help Parks and Recreation design and analyze surveys and other forms of community engagement to learn about the needs and views of the community.

Second, I have substantial fundraising experience. I previously ran a grassroots political campaign that raised approximately \$800,000 through small donations, I have assisted my universities (my employers) in various types of fundraising, and in 2020-2021, I designed and ran an online fundraising campaign to save the local community center / recreation center in my old neighborhood in Ottawa (where I lived from 2019-2023). At present, I am also the volunteer treasurer of a professional association (a section of the American Political Science Association), which has given me further financial management experience. As Boulder faces new financial strains, I would bring a new perspective and fundraising experience to the Parks and Rec board.

Third, I collaborate effectively with diverse colleagues and stakeholders. In my work at universities throughout the US and Canada, I have taught students from more than 50 countries, and I pro-actively incorporate activities to promote inclusion and equity in all my classes. I previously also speak Spanish fluently, which helps me communicate with a wider range of people in the Boulder area.

In terms of prior experience on boards or governing bodies, I was a board member, committee member, and fundraising chair of the Ottawa South Community Association (OSCA) from 2020-2023. This was the board that ran our local community center and recreation programming in the Old Ottawa South neighborhood, where I used to live in Ottawa, Ontario, Canada. We oversaw human resources issues and staff management, program development, and financial management. Within OSCA, I particularly specialized in fundraising, and I designed and implemented a grassroots online fundraising campaign to keep the community center financially viable during Ontario's lengthy

COVID lockdowns.

In Boulder, I am currently an active volunteer for two organizations: Guide Dogs for the Blind's Boulder puppy-raising club, and the Victim Advocates program at the Boulder police department. Through these two very different forms of community engagement, I have learned a lot about the needs and interests of a wide range of community residents.

Additionally, in my work as a professor, I routinely serve on a wide range of committees, including my department's budget committee, our graduate program committee, a division-wide management committee, and an anti-racism committee (at my prior university). This has given me experience running meetings efficiently, soliciting input from others, and making decisions collaboratively.

In terms of prior community involvement, when I lived in Cambridge, MA from 2013-2019, I was a participatory budgeting community delegate for one year. In this role, I worked with fellow delegates to propose projects for the participatory budgeting election. This involved meeting with city officials and community leaders and learning about city management and budgeting. I found it very satisfying to develop these proposals, and I really enjoyed making a concrete contribution to the city. (In particular, a semi-protected bike lane that I helped to propose was selected in the participatory budgeting election, and the bike lane was installed and is still in operation today.) This experience motivated me to join the OSCA board in Ottawa, and it is one of the reasons I hope to join the Parks and Recreation board in Boulder.

2. Have you had any experience(s) with this Board or the services it oversees?

I do not have any direct experience with this board. However, since moving to Boulder in 2023, my family and I have frequently used the city's rec centers, outdoor pools, and parks and recreation programming, including classes for children and adults and summer day camps.

In the city where I previously lived (Ottawa, Ontario), I served on the board of my local recreation center / community center for multiple years. In this capacity, I helped them develop programming, transition to a new registration system (Amilia, also used by Boulder Parks and Rec), and conduct community consultations about a new building planned for a local park. I also designed and led a fundraising effort to keep the center afloat during COVID lockdowns, ultimately raising more than \$100,000 in a campaign to save our community center.

3. If appointed, what do you hope to achieve through your service on this board/commission?

I would like to ensure that Boulder's excellent recreation centers and programming remain affordable, appealing, and accessible for local families.

Depending on the needs of the board, I am most interested in two areas:

- a) Community outreach and feedback. Especially as the recreation centers are raising their fees and the city has adopted the new Amilia registration system, I think it's important to make sure the city is meeting the community's needs, to assess how people are using the recreation centers, and to gather data about their experiences with the online registration system. I would be happy to contribute to designing surveys, focus groups, and other forms of feedback.
- b) Fundraising and financial management. I would be interested in helping the city develop new fundraising strategies (both grassroots and grant applications) to help fund parks and recreation programming.

I have lived in Boulder pretty much my entire life, and parks and recreation services made both a large impact on my childhood and makes an impact on me today. From learning how to swim in the rec center pools, to trying different sports and activities at the rec centers from basketball to dance to gymnastics, to even having my first job at the East Boulder rec center as a camp counselor when I was 16 years old, Boulder parks and rec services have been an instrumental part of my life. Even today, I regularly use Boulder parks and rec services, such as the Mapleton softball fields, where the youth softball team I coach plays their home softball games.

Having used so many parks and rec services, and especially since they have made such a large impact on me, I wish to serve on the parks and recreation advisory board to give back to the community and help ensure these resources are just as impactful and readily available for all members of the community as they have been for me. Additionally, as a young person (as someone in their early/mid 20s), and as someone who has primarily accessed the parks and rec services as a youth, I believe I would bring a unique perspective to the board. Also, since I volunteer coach a softball team of elementary age youth, I directly see the impact that Boulder parks and rec services have on our youth, which gives me another unique perspective.

I have also had experience with boards and commissions while I was in college at CU Boulder, and this experience would help to make me a more effective member. My senior year of college, I had an internship with the Youth Advisory Panel with the City of Westminster. The Youth Advisory Panel is a group of teens that meets with local leaders and boards to learn about and advise them on issues impacting Westminster. Why do you wish to serve on the board or commission, and what qualifications, skill sets and relevant experiences do you have for this position (such as lived experience, education, training, service on governing or decision-making boards, etc.) that would contribute to you being an effective board member and community representative?

In my full-time role with Movement Climbing Gyms, I oversee the climbing programming for six gyms across Colorado and two gyms in Chicago. Since moving to Boulder in 2019, the Movement Boulder gym at 28th Street and Valmont Road has served as the primary hub of my community and functions as a true third space where people gather not just to recreate, but to connect, share information, and engage with the city around them. Through my work at Movement, I have developed close working relationships with organizations like the Boulder Climbing Community, the Access Fund, and the American Alpine Club. In the case of the Boulder Climbing Community, I manage the memorandum of understanding between BCC and Movement, which involves coordinating shared goals, organizing outreach efforts, and maintaining an ongoing partnership that serves the local climbing community. I also volunteer as the Front Range Editor for Accidents in North American Climbing, an annual American Alpine Club publication that documents and examines climbing accidents from across North America. In that role, I review incident reports, work with contributors, and help translate real world incidents into clear, useful information for the public. This work has made me comfortable engaging with complex systems and analyzing how human factors are overwhelming the primary factor in climbing accidents, a perspective that feels directly relevant to transportation planning and policy.

Much of my professional experience centers on community engagement and public input. Currently, I am planning tabling events at Movement Boulder to gather feedback from the climbing community on how to better encourage members to use alternative transportation options such as walking, cycling, and the bus rather than driving, particularly given the limited parking available for a gym of its size. I believe that the TAB's advising to city council should be driven by data and expertise as well as the lived experiences of the community with a goal of driving what would best support a sustainable, high quality of life for residents and businesses.

My interest in transportation issues in Boulder is also informed by ongoing learning and reading. I am currently enrolled in a Coursera course, "Reclaiming the Street for Livable Urban Spaces", to gain a better understanding of what research studies exist on people-first transportation and urban development initiatives. Books such as Movement: How to Take Back Our Streets and Transform Our Lives by Thalia Verkade, Paved Paradise by Henry Grabar, and Killed by a Traffic Engineer by Wes Marshall have helped me better understand the historical, political, and economic forces that shape our city. Killed by a Traffic Engineer is especially relevant because it places an emphasis on transportation infrastructure and safety outcomes in

the greater Denver region, offering lessons that are directly applicable to Boulder. These perspectives have strengthened my ability to think critically about tradeoffs and how interconnected transportation decisions are with every other aspect of daily life.

On a personal level, I am also a regular bike commuter and rely on the bike path network throughout the city, especially the unprotected bike lanes along North 30th near where I currently live in Arbor Condominiums. Experiencing the city primarily by bicycle has given me a practical understanding of how infrastructure design, connectivity, and safety directly shape whether people feel comfortable choosing active transportation over driving. In the last month, I had experienced two near-misses while biking home Northbound along 30th near Mapleton. In both cases, it was daytime, I was wearing brightly colored clothing, and a car made an illegal right turn in front of me into a parking lot without yielding the right of way to me in the bike lane. In one of those cases, the driver did not have a turn signal on. After confronting the driver, he was very apologetic and shaken, sharing, "I am so, so sorry, I did not see you." These two instances occurred at nearly the same intersection of 30th and could have nearly ended in disaster for me. Though I'm grateful to have biked home with only a couple scratches on my bike, it is only by luck that I'm in a position to submit this application. With this, I have a renewed passion to help support the City of Boulder in its path toward its Vision Zero Action Plan and help shape a transportation network that reduces serious injuries and fatalities while improving quality of life for residents. These recent experiences have been formative in my newly gained interest in applying for the Transportation Advisory Board.

P.s. - As a tangential interest, I am an avid user of RTD to reduce my car dependency during work commutes to Denver and to the airport for work-related travel. With that, the added bonus of receiving a free EcoPass is a significant perk for me. If I am selected to join the Transportation Advisory Board, rest assured that the EcoPass will be fully taken advantage of.

2. Have you had any experience(s) with this Board or the services it oversees?

I did have the opportunity to speak with Blythe Bailey, Director of Transportation & Mobility Department, who works for the city in partnership with the TAB and had a very positive conversation in gaining insight into how the TAB seeks community input on road re-designs. I unfortunately was not able to participate in the community engagement event held last Summer for the North 30th Street redevelopment plan, but I did submit my feedback during the solicitation period before the final plans were decided.

3. If appointed, what do you hope to achieve through your service on this board/commission?

I hope to use this opportunity as much for my own education as for service back to the community. Through engaging in conversation with various stakeholder groups, including businesses, residents, advocacy organizations, vulnerable user groups, drivers, city staff, I hope to listen, learn, and contribute to transportation decisions that are grounded in lived experience and community input. Since no proposal comes without its outspoken critics, I wish to create the space to hear their concerns and see what I can offer in return. Oftentimes, criticism can stem from a misunderstanding of the situation or a lack of knowledge of what the data and research suggests as the ideal path forward. Other times, the criticism is perfectly valid and is not being adequately taken into account, in which case I would advocate on behalf of those unheard perspectives.

If appointed to TAB, I would also hope to support stronger and more transparent communication between the City and residents around transportation planning. Online forums such as Reddit often surface frustration and a perception that the City is not listening or not clearly communicating its goals and constraints. I believe there is an opportunity to meet people where they already are by engaging in these spaces, including hosting occasional ask me anything style discussions with staff or board members to explain plans, timelines, and tradeoffs and to invite more informed community feedback.

Narrative:

I wish to serve on the Transportation Advisory Board to apply my background in complex regulatory policy, public interest law, and transportation issues to Boulder's evolving mobility challenges. As an avid cyclist and a legal professional who has successfully defended critical public transit funding in court, I want to contribute to the rigorous analysis required to implement Boulder's Transportation Master Plan, advance Vision Zero goals, and ensure our infrastructure is safe, sustainable, and accessible for all users.

My qualifications for this position are rooted in a career spent navigating high-stakes regulatory environments and advocating for public infrastructure. A highlight of my public service career was my work as an Assistant Attorney General in Washington, where I successfully defended the Central Puget Sound Regional Transit Authority (Sound Transit) against a class action lawsuit. In that case, I helped protect tens of millions of dollars in tax revenue essential for the region's public transit expansion. This experience gave me a deep appreciation for the complex legal and fiscal frameworks that underpin successful transit systems.

Currently, as Corporate Counsel at Google in Boulder, I manage complex compliance initiatives and lead cross-functional stakeholder groups to develop company-wide policy on AI and in other areas. This role requires balancing competing interests and

translating intricate regulations into practical operational guidance-skills directly transferable to analyzing traffic engineering studies, capital improvement budgets, and multi-modal policy. Previously, while working at a litigation firm in Seattle, I drafted legislation enacted by the City of Puyallup to more humanely address homelessness. This gave me direct insight into the legislative process and the mechanics of writing municipal ordinances-skills that are equally critical when refining city transportation code and policy.

Prior to my time in the private sector, my work as a trial attorney at the U.S. Department of Justice Environment & Natural Resources Division and the Washington Attorney General's Office involved managing complex litigation that often intersected with government agency decision-making. I have a track record of defending state agencies in difficult cases, which has prepared me to help the Board navigate the often contentious public process of infrastructure development.

I also bring significant "lived experience" to this role. As an avid cyclist and outdoor enthusiast, I experience Boulder's transportation network daily-not just from behind the windshield of a car, but as a vulnerable road user. In the warmer months I frequently commute to work via ebike, and I'm excited to start using the new bike lane that will connect Gunbarrel (where I live) with downtown. I understand the on-the-ground reality of protected lanes, intersection safety, and trail connectivity. I'm currently a member of the Orchard Creek Homeowner's Association Board, helping the board to navigate complex updates to our bylaws regarding property usage, which requires building consensus among residents with differing views.

I hold a J.D. from Harvard Law School and a B.A. from Stanford University. After law school I clerked for the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals. My combination of high-level policy strategy, direct experience defending transit funding, and a personal commitment to multi-modal transport positions me to be an effective and analytical member of the Transportation Advisory Board.

2. Have you had any experience(s) with this Board or the services it oversees?

I have not previously served on the Transportation Advisory Board. However, I have deep professional and personal experience with the services the Board oversees, specifically regarding public transit funding, municipal code enforcement, and multi-modal infrastructure.

My experience with the services this Board oversees includes:

Defending Public Transit Systems: As an Assistant Attorney General, I represented the Central Puget Sound Regional Transit Authority (Sound Transit). I successfully defended the agency against a class action lawsuit, protecting tens of millions of dollars in tax revenue dedicated to transit expansion. This gave me a direct, behind-the-scenes understanding of the fiscal and legal challenges involved in maintaining and expanding a large-scale public transportation network.

Drafting Municipal Code: The Board advises on policy and code changes. While working as a private attorney, I drafted municipal legislation that was enacted by the City of Puyallup. I understand the specific mechanics of how City Council ordinances are written, reviewed, and implemented—experience I would apply when the Board reviews updates to the Boulder Revised Code regarding transportation standards.

Lived Experience as a "Vulnerable Road User": I interact with Boulder's transportation services daily as a cyclist. I rely on the city's network of protected lanes, multi-use paths, and intersections. I understand intimately where our infrastructure succeeds in keeping non-automotive users safe, and where gaps remain that align with the city's Vision Zero goals.

Governance Experience: I currently serve on the Board of the Orchard Creek Homeowner's Association, where I manage community assets and navigate the consensus-building process required for local infrastructure decisions.

3. If appointed, what do you hope to achieve through your service on this board/commission?

If appointed, I hope to translate my professional background in regulatory analysis and public service into concrete, actionable improvements for Boulder's transportation network. My goal is to help the Board provide the City Council with recommendations that are not only aspirational but legally sound, fiscally responsible, and operationally viable.

Specifically, I hope to achieve four outcomes:

1. Accelerating Vision Zero through Data-Driven Policy

As a daily cyclist, I am personally invested in the safety of our streets. However, my professional background as a trial attorney has taught me that effective regulation requires rigorous evidence. I hope to help the Board prioritize infrastructure projects that are supported by data to most effectively reduce conflicts between vehicles and vulnerable road users. I want to ensure our move toward Vision Zero is efficient and focuses resources on the highest-risk corridors.

2. Fiscal Stewardship of Transportation Assets

Drawing on my experience defending the Central Puget Sound Regional Transit Authority (Sound Transit) in court, I understand that bold transportation goals fail without secure funding and fiscal discipline. I hope to apply that scrutiny to the Board's review of the Capital Improvement Program (CIP). I want to ensure that every dollar of tax revenue is maximized to deliver projects that are sustainable and maintainable in the long term.

3. Pragmatic Code Modernization

Having drafted municipal legislation enacted by the City of Puyallup, I understand how difficult it is to translate high-level goals into enforceable city code. I hope to use this experience to help the Board review and refine the Boulder Revised Code, removing friction for multi-modal infrastructure projects. My objective is to support policy updates that make it easier, not harder, to build the connectivity required for a growing, modern city.

4. Consensus-Based Governance

Finally, I want to foster a culture of rigorous analysis. Whether we are discussing e-bike regulations or transit corridors, I hope to ensure our recommendations are stress-tested. My goal is to be a board member who listens to all stakeholders-residents, businesses, and commuters-and applies a technical lens to find the most reasonable path forward.

- Transportation has been and will continue to be an increasingly important issue in Boulder and regionally. This also was true of Seattle, where I lived for 18 years, and in Hong Kong, where I lived for 7 years. It is a subject that I have followed closely for many years because of the impact that decisions regarding transportation can have on the community.

- Boulder needs to ensure that transportation decisions are taken by groups with balanced perspectives. It should not be pro or anti-bike, public transport, car, or whatever, but a balanced view that takes into account the combination of modes of transportation that can and must be accommodated to further community / regional priorities (mobility, congestion, pollution, convenience, safety, community, etc.).

- I have worked across a wide variety of geographies and cultures (in the US, Asia, Europe, and Latin America) across a variety of industries (consumer goods, media, technology). This experience has helped me develop my ability to listen to different points of view and to help synthesize those views/priorities in ways that allow broader groups to gain a better understanding. I also have been able to develop close, trusting relationships with different groups that then allowed me to help larger groups reach consensus more readily.

My background could be very helpful in the context of decisions where there is no one "right" answer, but rather decisions that balance a variety of competing, legitimate priorities.

2. Have you had any experience(s) with this Board or the services it oversees?

I have not. I have, however, closely followed transportation issues in a variety of contexts (in Hong Kong, in Seattle, and here in Boulder).

3. If appointed, what do you hope to achieve through your service on this board/commission?

I hope to be able to help the TAB and the City of Boulder make progress in moving transportation projects forward by helping to build consensus on the competing objectives and priorities. I want to serve on the Transportation Advisory Board because Boulder's transportation system shapes so much of daily life here, and I care about how people move through our city. I bike and walk for most of my trips, rely on transit to get to CU and around town, and I also drive when the trip, weather, or timing makes that the most practical option. Using the system in all of these ways has shown me what works well and where gaps make it harder for people of different ages, abilities, and neighborhoods to get around safely and reliably. I'm interested in helping the city think about these challenges at a system level while staying grounded in the lived experiences of residents, students, visitors, and commuters.

My background is in engineering and systems planning, and I'm currently a Ph.D. candidate in aerospace engineering at CU Boulder who plans to stay in Boulder after I finish my degree. My research focuses on planning and scheduling problems, which has trained me to understand complex networks, competing priorities, and the critical role of tradeoffs. Just as importantly, I have learned how to explain those tradeoffs in accessible ways. I've also led engineering teams of more than 50 people, which taught me how to bring together a wide range of perspectives, ask good questions, and help groups make decisions collaboratively. Those skills translate well to TAB's role of reviewing staff work, engaging with the community, and offering constructive, big-picture feedback.

At the same time, I know transportation is not just an engineering problem. It's about people, safety, access, and the choices we make as a community. I'm drawn to TAB because it sits at the intersection of technical analysis and public values. I want to contribute by listening carefully, understanding how different parts of Boulder experience our transportation system differently, and helping the board reflect those perspectives as we consider projects and policies.

I'm committed to supporting staff and Council by asking thoughtful questions, respecting staff expertise and time, and helping ensure that our transportation decisions reflect the needs and values of the community, especially when safety, climate goals, costs, and convenience pull in different directions. As a multimodal user who is invested in Boulder's long-term transportation future, I would bring both analytical skills and a resident's perspective to the board.

2. Have you had any experience(s) with this Board or the services it oversees?

As a four-year resident of Boulder and a regular user of our transportation system, I've had a lot of firsthand experience with the services TAB oversees. In a typical week, I bike about two hours for commuting, walk two to three hours for errands, take two or more bus trips when routes and timing allow, and drive when the trip, weather, or schedule makes that the most practical option. I also spend several hours on our paths for recreation. Using the system in all of these ways has given me a clear sense of where Boulder's network works well and where gaps make it harder for people to get around safely and reliably.

Living near 28th and Mapleton, I see very different parts of the system up close: the pedestrian-friendly areas west toward downtown, the car-oriented environment along 28th Street, and the emerging transit-focused development at Boulder Junction. Moving through these areas as a pedestrian, cyclist, transit rider, and driver has shown me how different neighborhoods experience transportation differently, and how small improvements, like a flashing crosswalk, can make a big difference for safety and comfort. I've also seen how missing links, such as bike paths that don't connect across major intersections, can make a mode effectively inaccessible for many people.

I've followed TAB discussions on projects such as the 28th Street improvements and the city's Vision Zero work, and I've watched TAB meetings and read staff materials to understand how TAB evaluates projects and provides feedback. Those conversations have helped me appreciate how TAB balances technical analysis, community input, and citywide goals. My own experience using the system every day gives me a practical perspective on how transportation decisions affect people at the neighborhood level and across the city.

3. If appointed, what do you hope to achieve through your service on this board/commission?

If appointed, I hope to help Boulder make transportation decisions that reflect both our long-term goals and the day-to-day experiences of the people who move through the city. I want to support Council and staff by asking thoughtful questions, listening carefully to community members, and helping ensure that transportation choices are grounded in safety, access, and the values laid out in the Transportation Master Plan.

As someone in a younger demographic that is becoming less common in Boulder, I also hope to bring a perspective that reflects the experiences of residents who are early in their careers and planning to build a life and family here. Many people my age want to stay in Boulder, and I've seen how transportation plays a role in whether that feels possible. I want to help make sure those needs are represented alongside the needs of older adults, families, and long-time residents.

In my own experience using the system every day, I've seen how design choices shape whether a neighborhood feels connected or difficult to navigate. On TAB, I would work to elevate those on-the-ground insights while keeping sight of citywide goals like Vision Zero, improved transit reliability, and better connections between neighborhoods. My aim is to help TAB provide clear, constructive feedback that supports staff, respects community input, and helps Boulder make transportation decisions that serve residents now and in the future.

Why do you wish to serve on the board or commission, and what qualifications, skill sets and relevant experiences do you have for this position (such as lived experience, education, training, service on governing or decision-making boards, etc.) that would contribute to you being an effective board member and community representative?

I wish to continue serving on the Transportation Advisory Board because transportation policy and multimodal safety are foundational to Boulder's livability, equity, and climate goals. Over the past two years, I have found the work deeply rewarding, and I believe I have developed the judgment, institutional knowledge, and collaborative skills necessary to help TAB provide consistent, practical guidance to City Council.

Since 2023, I have served on Community Cycles' Advocacy Committee, where I engage with diverse constituencies, strengthening my ability to understand varied perspectives and find common ground. I have garnered a deep familiarity with Boulder's transportation services, having participated in many city-led engagements on major projects like the Iris Avenue Improvement Project and having engaged in public comment on bike infrastructure design analyses.

My qualifications include professional experience in governance and technical oversight, as well as extensive community engagement on complex public issues. Before joining TAB, I served on expert governance panels in my scientific career, including weekly leadership meetings for NCAR's community climate model governance and international scientific collaboration projects. I also have a long history of community organizing and public engagement that spans activism, board service, editorial writing, and community forums.

In addition, I serve on the executive board of Boulder Progressives, where I work with a broad coalition of community members to develop policy priorities and engage constructively with city decision-making processes. That experience has strengthened my ability to listen across differences, weigh competing values, and communicate policy tradeoffs clearly, skills that are directly applicable to TAB's advisory role.

My background in scientific governance and community organizing continues to inform how I approach TAB's work: asking hard questions, grounding decisions in evidence, and navigating disagreement without losing sight of shared goals. On TAB, I strive to ask clarifying questions, support staff when appropriate, and help translate policy goals into practical guidance that can actually be implemented.

In 2025, I wrote a guest editorial in the Daily Camera titled "Vision Zero is serious and cities are proving it works," where I highlighted national evidence showing that sustained safety improvements reduce serious injuries and deaths when they are backed by design intervention and community commitment. That piece grew out of the same evidence-based approach I bring to

TAB: using data and documented outcomes to evaluate policy rather than anecdotes or assumptions. This perspective reinforces why Boulder must move beyond slogans to concrete steps on corridors where crashes most often occur.

My training, civic experience, and history of effective board-level contributions equip me to continue serving TAB as a thoughtful, informed, and committed community representative.

2. Have you had any experience(s) with this Board or the services it oversees?

Yes. I have served on TAB since 2024 after being appointed to fill the remainder of a five-year term. During this tenure, I have participated in full board deliberations on the Core Arterial Network (CAN), Vision Zero implementation, parking reform, transit coordination, and design standards. I have asked clarifying questions, supported staff recommendations when they align with TAB's goals, and helped frame issues in ways that Council and the community can understand.

I have worked collaboratively with fellow board members, city staff, and community stakeholders, and I have gained a strong understanding of TAB's advisory role, the limits of its authority, and how its recommendations interact with City Council decision-making. I regularly engage with the transportation services overseen by the city and stay informed through staff materials, data presentations, and public feedback. I believe that I have an excellent working relationship with the city's current staff in the Transportation and Mobility Department, including Director Blythe Bailey and Deputy Director Valerie Watson.

In addition to board meetings, I have engaged with transportation services through public comment, community meetings, and media participation. In 2023, I appeared on Denver7 with TAB member Tila Duhaime to discuss the newly installed Baseline Road protected bike lanes. I have attended numerous public forums on transportation projects, including Iris Avenue and CDOT's Colorado 7 corridor work. I attended Boulder's World Day of Remembrance for Traffic Victims event and other community transportation gatherings. My family history includes the tragic event of my dear grandmother having to witness her own 5-year-old brother being killed by a milk truck when she was only 8 years old herself. These experiences have deepened my understanding of the transportation ecosystem TAB oversees, including where policy intersects with community expectations, safety outcomes, and equity challenges.

3. If appointed, what do you hope to achieve through your service on this board/commission?

If appointed to a full five-year term, I hope to help TAB continue its evolution as a credible, data-informed advisory body that advances Boulder's transportation goals in safety, sustainability, equity, and connectivity.

A central priority for me is supporting the full, timely, and effective implementation of the Core Arterial Network (CAN), so that our high-injury corridors are redesigned to protect people walking, biking, and rolling. I also want TAB to help ensure that Vision Zero is implemented in ways that produce measurable reductions in serious injury and fatality, not simply policy statements.

Another top priority is ensuring our parking management system supports multimodal access and land use goals without undermining affordability or equity. For example, I would like TAB to advance a phased effort to apply our updated bike rack standards retroactively to existing developments. Existing commercial and mixed-use areas often have very poor or no bike parking for customers, employees, and residents. A phased program to bring these locations up to modern standards would improve access, support alternative modes, and reinforce Boulder's transportation and climate goals.

I also hope to contribute to clearer community communication about transportation funding and project timelines, especially for large initiatives that can be misunderstood without context. In addition, I would like TAB to continue helping Boulder coordinate regional transit planning so that local decisions are aligned with broader Front Range mobility needs.

Overall, my goal is to ensure that TAB provides recommendations that are equitable, evidence-based, and implementable, helping Boulder navigate complex tradeoffs while advancing a transportation system that is safer, more sustainable, and more accessible for all residents.

My friends and family also utilize the transportation system, but unfortunately, multiple have been injured by vehicles. As a member of the board, I would have vested interest in improving the safety of Boulder and realizing Vision Zero.

While I majored and work in computer science, I have always been fascinated by city-building and how transportation decisions can shape cities. In my spare time, I have read many books on transportation issues and philosophies, and I truly enjoy thorough discussions on the topic, which my coworkers gently tease me about. At my job, my team regularly engages in long and thorough discussions about our systems to devise solutions to problems. We balance the time to implement, cost, and quality of the solution based on the situation. Additionally, I lead a community group dedicated to UI development, including managing a shared code library, running meetings, and supporting individual members of the community. These are all experiences that would help me fulfill my role on the Transportation Advisory Board where. I hope to support, engage with, and give back to the people of Boulder.

2. Have you had any experience(s) with this Board or the services it oversees?

I have attended multiple Transportation Advisory Board meetings and used multiple facilities managed by the Transportation and Mobility department. Throughout my K-12 education and attending CU Boulder, I regularly commuted using the bus system, as well as walking, biking, and driving around Boulder. I invested in an e-bike last year and have been biking even more since then, even generally forgoing my car when traveling in Boulder.

3. If appointed, what do you hope to achieve through your service on this board/commission?

I have many ideas that I think could have a positive impact in both bringing Boulder closer to its Vision Zero goal and creating a more thriving, people-first community. These are some ideas that I would particularly focus on.

I would like to help establish a community-oriented, small capital change trial process, or, if such a process exists, work to make it more well-known to the public. This could allow for small trials of changes before the city/community commits to a more permanent change. Ideally, there would be a small group of city staff who would work with communities to identify small issues that could be somewhat improved with simple changes. These changes need not be the best solution, but they should be cheap and give some basic idea of the viability of a more permanent change.

Another idea is to expand the reactive response of the city to crashes involving a vehicle. Currently, the city uses crash hotspot data to prioritize high-incident intersections and makes changes to those intersections based on current best practices. I would like to expand this process to evaluate crashes themselves, investigating how the infrastructure may have contributed to particular crashes and what changes can be made to reduce or remove the risk of a similar accident happening again.

I understand that I may not be able to fully realize such processes in my limited time, but I believe even the beginnings of such a process could create engagement by the community, leading to a more community-oriented Boulder.
