Building Performance Ordinance Level II Energy Assessment

The City of Boulder is offering rebates for Level II energy assessments to help offset the costs for commercial and industrial building owners subject to the Building Performance Ordinance.

Please complete the following application and submit to the City of Boulder with a price quote from your selected approved service provider.

Rebates Available

2016-2017: Up to 30% of total cost *

2018: Up to 20% of total cost*

2019: Reduced rebates may be available*

*See terms and conditions for details.

Applications must be received by Dec. 31, 2017 to be eligible for 2016-2017 funding and will be issued on a first-come, first-served basis. Reduced rebates will be issued in 2018 and 2019 until funds are allocated.

Customer Process

Step 1 Obtain Project Bid from Qualified Service Provider

Step 2 Submit Selected Project Bid to City of Boulder with Completed Application to Reserve Rebate Funds

Step 3 Complete Level II Energy Assessment with Service Provider

Step 4 Work with Service Provider to Ensure Energy Assessment Findings are Reported to City of Boulder for Building Performance Ordinance Compliance

Step 5 Submit Copy of Paid Invoice to City of Boulder and Request Rebate Payment

Terms and Conditions

➤ **Rebate Funds**

The City of Boulder has allocated \$450,000 for Level II energy assessment rebates for 2016, 2017, and 2018. Funds will not be allocated in 2019. However, if funding from prior years is available, rebates may be granted until the energy assessment deadline of June 1, 2019.

Rebates will be issued on a first-come, first-served basis through May 31, 2019 or until funds are allocated – whichever occurs first. These rebates are put in place to encourage early adoption of the energy assessment requirement and the amount of the rebate will lessen as the deadline approaches as shown below:

Date of Completed Assessment	Rebate Amount*
Jan. 1-Dec. 31, 2016	Up to 30% of owner cost
Jan. 1-Dec. 31, 2017	Up to 30% of owner cost
Jan. 1-Dec. 31, 2018	Up to 20% of owner cost
Jan 1. 2019-May 31, 2019	Up to 10% of owner cost

*All rebates are capped at \$12,000 per building and cannot reduce the cost of the energy assessment to the building owner below \$0.06/sf.

The rebate funds will be reserved based on the date the City of Boulder receives the application. However, the final amount of the rebate will be determined based on the date of the paid invoice.

➤ **Eligibility**

City of Boulder Level II energy assessment rebates are available to commercial and industrial building owners within the City of Boulder subject to the Boulder Building Performance Ordinance and using the findings of the Level II energy assessment to comply with the ordinance. In-house energy assessors will be excluded from these rebates.

Building owners must use an Approved Service Provider to use the findings of this Level II energy assessment for compliance with the Building Performance Ordinance. Approved service providers are listed on the City of Boulder website www.BoulderBuildingPerformance.com.

Cost Pass-through to Tenants

If a building owner chooses to pass-through the cost of the Level II energy assessment to the building tenants, the cost must be amortized over 10 years per the Building Performance Ordinance.

➤ **Building Performance Ordinance Compliance Reporting**

The service provider must submit the Level II energy assessment findings to the City of Boulder for compliance as described in the Efficiency How-to Guides on the website www.BoulderBuildingPerformance.com. Failure to do so will result in the building owners’ non-compliance with the Building Performance Ordinance. Rebate checks will not be issued until the energy assessment has been reported to the City of the Boulder.

The Building Performance Ordinance requires building owners to share the results of the Level II energy assessment with all tenants of the building.
