Debris flow (e.g. CA that killed 23 people) - remedy could include debris basins in conjunction with Boulder County?

Wastewater collection system is similar to water system. Wastewater laterals at the home and City is increasing the capacity of the downstream pipelines to mitigate back ups.

Informing property owners / renters - full disclosure upon sale or rental - so that a party is educated regarding the flooding risk. Education of informing on risk.

Residents assume that they are safe when they move in. Tighten up regulations (and increase enforcement) to make habitable structures safe.
