

Scope and Work of the AP

AP will provide perspective and recommendations for initial recommendations and complex projects AND will be informed on additional initiatives by the City and Xcel.

Initial Recommendations

- Items that require staff time, but relatively low capital
- Likely focus on communication & awareness
 - e.g., review incomebased programs, workforce development

Complex Projects

- Longer lead time
- May require significant capital investments
- May require regulatory or legislative changes
 - e.g., vehicle to grid program, neighborhood microgrid

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
