
Crime is not random – crime clusters across places, people, & activities that can help us all understand patterns and take preventative measures.

Pareto Principle or 80-20 Rule: 80% of Results/Consequence come from 20% of Sources/Causes




2021 Crime by Geographical Area

CRIME PREVENTION

Situational Crime Prevention (SCP) provides actions for harm prevention. These actions revolve around increasing the effort, increasing the risks, reducing the rewards, reducing provocations, and removing excuses for crime.
