
Q13 How do you most often get around East Boulder?

I moved here in the early 90's for the quiet, open space, greenery and views. Now, I fear that Arapahoe and the local business areas will be perpetually under construction. Arapahoe and 55th, especially are not scaled for more traffic. No housing for seniors that want to downsize living spaces but not go into apartments. Have to walk more than a mile for public transportation and then have multiple connections to get to other spots in Boulder.

Why does the map not go to Baseline? Missing a key piece of the SE Boulder area. We have lived off 55th at Baseline and now at Cherryvale/Dimmit. Very similar issues as the mapped areas.

The East Boulder subcommunity has the best potential for development of the Arts in all of Boulder. It's the only place where rents are low enough that musicians, actors, performers, etc., can rehearse and perform without paying exorbitant rental fees, such as at the Dairy and other commercial venues closer to Pearl Street. Developing performing artists are priced out of traditional venues in Boulder. If rents go up in the East Boulder subcommunity because of increased density in this area, the local Arts community in this area will have to leave Boulder entirely when their leases expire and commercial rents rise or buildings are destroyed to put in high-density affordable housing.

mixed used housing (commercial with residential, townhomes with built in

parking) and bike overpasses (crossing over highways is not safe) on main roads are super important to quality of life as it grows. such potential. Flood mitigation plans and implementation/construction of improved drainage conveyances needs to be done prior to any development plans or redevelopment plans, especially in the SE area along Arapahoe. The 2015 South Boulder Creek Flood Mitigation Plan Phase 3 extends into this subcommunity. Drainage conveyances under Arapahoe and under the train tracks need to be enlarged. The permeable land needs to be preserved. The two ditches, Dry Creek #2 and Howard, need improved capacities. During the 2013 Flood, Arapahoe was closed and impassible between 55th and Cherryvale: the businesses north of Arapahoe between 55th and South Boulder Creek were under water. New roads for car traffic need to be built and connected between multiple properties so that traffic is funneled into signalized intersections along Arapahoe, 55th, Pearl and Valmont. Properties along Arapahoe need an additional access point for flood/emergency; for example the properties between 55th and South Boulder Creek need an extension of Western Ave. for connection to 55th and for connection to a new signalized intersection at Flatirons Golf Course.

We (my wife and I) are very concerned that our studio rent is going to go up and that we and other artists will be priced out of the neighborhood. So we're developing contingency plans and beginning to explore spaces outside of Boulder, but we really don't want to move the business.

I own a business in East Boulder with 5 employees. The recent development that has been heading in this direction is alarming. As the City of Boulder continues to raise property values, our landlords continue to raise rent at a rate not congruent with the prices we are able to charge for our products. Boulder has long ago passed the threshold similar to Aspen, Telluride, etc where that people who "make the town work" are not able to afford to live here. Now, the encroaching development and higher rents are chasing out the actual business's that "make the town work". This city seems to be on an unstable course of growth.

Public Transportation does not run often enough to make this a viable public transportation destination.

I live just south of this east boulder boundary.... Don't condense everything into this area... We need some relief from traffic and having all businesses and industry and everything around us... Put some in north boulder where the hospital was... Also put a lot on baseline and broadway... And what about Mapleton and 4th street... Please don't continue to take away our neighborhoodlife off of Arapahoe and 55th... You are making west Boulder "the place to live" and east Boulder along Arapahoe the wrong side of town with all the congestion and density you are building here. I have lived here since 69 and this just isn't what I want to see. Why "pick on" this east boulder community? Spread it out - please... Put some high rise apartments on Baseline where Chataqua is.... 
The Municipal Airport is ruining the neighborhood - too much noisy plane traffic. The air quality in this area is amongst the worst in the state of Colorado. Exposing more people to its detrimental health effects by building housing there doesn't make sense to me.

I am very concerned about dense development along Arapahoe Rd. I do not see that the infrastructure as it exists can accommodate additional housing, and business, or traffic. The surrounding infrastructure is already overused as an overflow alternative and forces automobile traffic into residential neighborhoods during rush hour. I cannot see how encouraging additional development is of benefit. I appreciate that the city believes in alternative transportation, however the reality is that people love their cars and if you observe the rush hour traffic coming from and returning to east Boulder County, the overwhelming majority of those vehicles are single passenger. I am an avid cyclist and use my bicycle for both recreation and transportation. My work is within the scope of this project as well. I avoid Arapahoe at all costs! It has got to be one of the more dangerous roads for cyclists in Boulder County. The bike/ multi-use path is unclear to cyclists as well as

motorists. The speed limit is too high and the volume of vehicles is enormous. I utilize the surrounding neighborhoods and connect to the bike path system whenever possible. Our ecosystem is also at risk with the development plans. The flood six years ago brought some challenges to light. Our neighborhood is also home to wildlife that have easy access to water and food. We support a variety of songbirds, birds of prey, foxes, rodents, coyotes, deer, etc...I would hate to see them chased out. One of the great treasures of Boulder County is our open space and (rapidly diminishing) agricultural heritage. I understand that there is demand for development, but I am not convinced that this is the proper approach.






Q17 What is your age range?




Q18 What gender do you identify with most?


