It would be interesting to see the city provide a grant to the university for a senior design capstone project or a graduate studies project. 2. The mix between low housing inventory, need for affordable housing, unnecessarily complex building permit process, and the various prairie dog conservation fields all work together to really make equitability in Boulder very difficult. If the city wants to protect prairie dogs that's fine but it comes at a cost of housing inequality. There is a large field on the corner of Jay and 47th street that, if managed similarly to the project east of diagonal, could provide roughly 800 affordable housing units. The permit process in Bolder also VASTLY needs overhauling. Compared to other cities across the country, a great local example would be Denver, there is an extremely steep learning curve to making improvements to your property inside city limits. This results in many landlords not pulling proper permits for routine work as well as individual home owners. The result is a select few ?custom home builders? who have figured out the complex process and thus drive prices accordingly. This barrier of entry must be addressed to both increase equity and safety within the cities housing.

ALSO the City of Boulder should put pressure on CU to pay non-tenure track faculty a fair professional wage so they can afford to live in Boulder and be treated as respected members of our community (rather than an exploited class of workers). Part of this is granting unionized faculty collective bargaining rights at the state level.
